Friends of Cheney Public Schools,

When the regular school day ends at 3:00 p.m. it actually is just a short break in an extended day that lasts until 5:30 p.m. for many of our students. Thanks to the support of our community, our students have the opportunity to participate in a variety of after-school activities – including school-based athletic programs. Our students, grades 6-12, are provided a safe, quality environment in which to continue to learn and grow on the playfield until they ride the activity bus home at 5:30 p.m.

The great news about offering students access to a school-based athletic program is that research shows that students who engage in after-school activities perform better in school! Surprisingly, even though participation in sports requires more time, it is associated with higher GPAs, lower dropout rates, better performance on standardized tests such as the ACT and state assessments, and a stronger commitment to school. This result is one of the reasons that our Board of Directors has supported our no-cut practice for middle and high school sports. What this means is that if a student wants to participate in a sport, a spot on a team will be provided. When we have more students show up to participate in a sport than we had anticipated, we create additional teams so that all of our students can participate.

We offer a wide variety of sports in which students may participate. In the fall of the school year our middle and high school students can participate in cross country, football, girls' soccer, girls' swimming, volleyball, or softball (middle school). The total number of students participating in our school-based athletic program this fall is 532. This is over 24% of our student population!

A positive correlation between participation in extracurricular activities and academic achievement has been researched and replicated several times in recent years. One reason is to identify specifically why busier students are also such good students. For now, we will leave that question for the researchers to study further; in the meantime, we will continue to provide students with co-curricular opportunities because we are also thrilled to witness other less tangible results.

We witness respect, responsibility, citizenship, courage, fairness, and gratitude to name a few of the character traits that are exemplified by our student athletes. We see our teenagers learning the importance of teamwork, creating new friendships, and developing stronger relationships with the adults who coach and mentor them. In most cases, those adults are our teachers – excellent role models for our youth. In the end, we are pleased to share that it all adds up to improved student achievement - and that is a very good thing!
