We are very fortunate in the Cheney Public Schools to have an outstanding working relationship with local law enforcement which helps us to ensure safety and security at each of our school sites. You may know that, as a result of a contract for services with the City of Cheney, our School Resource Officer is actually a commissioned officer with the Cheney Police Department. Sergeant Kelly Hembach provides direct service to the schools on all matters of safety and security.

For example, one of the responsibilities of Sergeant Hembach is to provide guidance to our administration when we conduct safety drills such as fire drills and lock down drills. During a planned lock down drill, Sergeant Hembach is on site to review the process that the staff and students follow to execute the lock down drill plan. Feedback is provided to administration to ensure that our practices continue to improve and are always in line with the latest guidance.

Another one of Sergeant Hembach's responsibilities is to follow up on any concerns that are reported on our 24-hour Safe Schools Alert website. Safety concerns may be reported via a text message, email message, website contact, or telephone call. We know that tips help make our school community an even safer place to work and learn. Of course, if a staff member or student is in immediate danger or a tip is in regard to a life-threatening emergency, they know to call 911.

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## **Emergency preparedness**

In the event of a real emergency, school officials communicate through Sergeant Hembach as our liaison with local police such as the Airway Heights Police Department, Spokane County Sheriff's Office, Eastern Washington University Police, and Washington State Patrol.



We have established procedures for communication that help to ensure immediate response. Last summer and during the winter break we practiced "community-wide" emergency events that involved the local police and fire departments. These events are a regular part of their training, and our schools provided the location for conducting their drills. On February 11, EWU Police Chief Tim Walters, who is a nationally known expert, provided professional development to district staff members concerning school safety and school violence.

Rest assured that our local law and fire departments work closely with our school officials to make certain that we are prepared in the event of a real emergency.

### **Prevention**

One of the ways that we can ensure a safe learning environment for our students is for students to know exactly what to do if they have a question or concern about safety.

Our counselors and our teachers help students understand the importance of talking with an



adult if they ever feel unsafe. Adults respond quickly to student concerns and take swift action.
