Going to a new school can be a scary experience for an elementary student—but for the approximately 400 students who will be transferring to Phil Snowdon Elementary School this fall the term they use to describe it is “Excited!” Our little “Cougars” will join their friends and many familiar adult faces at their new school. They will have room to grow and learn in the new instructional environment that has been thoughtfully designed by teachers, administrators, and support staff to provide a state-of-the-art educational program for them.

The school has two wings: a primary (grades PK-2) wing and an intermediate (grades 3-5) wing. The design team created spaces for small groups of students to work and learn together in an area directly outside of the classroom. We described this area as a “POD.” There are four in the school, with two conveniently located in each wing. The preschool and kindergarten students have access to an enclosed playground which is designed with small play structures for younger children and ensures their safety. Other specialty rooms include the music room, project room, library/computer lab, and gymnasium. The music room opens up to become a stage for concerts and other planned performances—making efficient use of the space. The project room provides a space for students to “get messy”—completing science projects or art projects. The library has an instructional space, reading space and new computer lab for researching and completing technology rich projects. The gymnasium is flooded with natural light and has a shock absorbent floor that helps prevent injuries.

This beautiful new facility has been constructed on time and under budget. We are so very grateful to you, our patrons, for your support of the children in our District. As a result of your support, the over-crowded environment that our children have experienced in recent years will become a distant memory.

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
Phil Snowdon Elementary is ready for kids
