FACULTY/SCHEDULE

- Student to Faculty Ratio is 7:1
- Class size averages 14 students
- In the Upper School, 65% of the faculty and administrative staff hold master's degrees and 9% hold doctorate degrees
- Periods 1-4 meet on one day, and 5-8 on the next. Classes are approximately 80 minutes
- Students in Grades 9 & 10 take seven classes a semester and students in Grades 11 & 12 carry a minimum of six

*Religion courses are as academically rigorous as other core courses. Offerings include World Religion, Great Christian Thinkers, Interreligious Issues and Behavior, and Catholic Social Teaching.

GRADE POINT SYSTEM

Previously, Carrollton reported both a weighted and unweighted average. Honors courses received an extra .5 and AP, AT and IB courses an additional 1.0. Beginning with the Class of 2022, Honors, AP, AT, and IB will no longer be awarded extra points when calculating a grade point average, and the grade point average we report will be unweighted.

RANK IN CLASS

Since Carrollton is small and strictly college preparatory, there is generally a negligible range in students' grade averages. Therefore, it is our school policy not to assign class rank.

HONOR SOCIETIES

Because Honor Societies require a service component, students may be active members in no more than three of the eight subject area honor societies and National Honor Society for a total of four commitments.



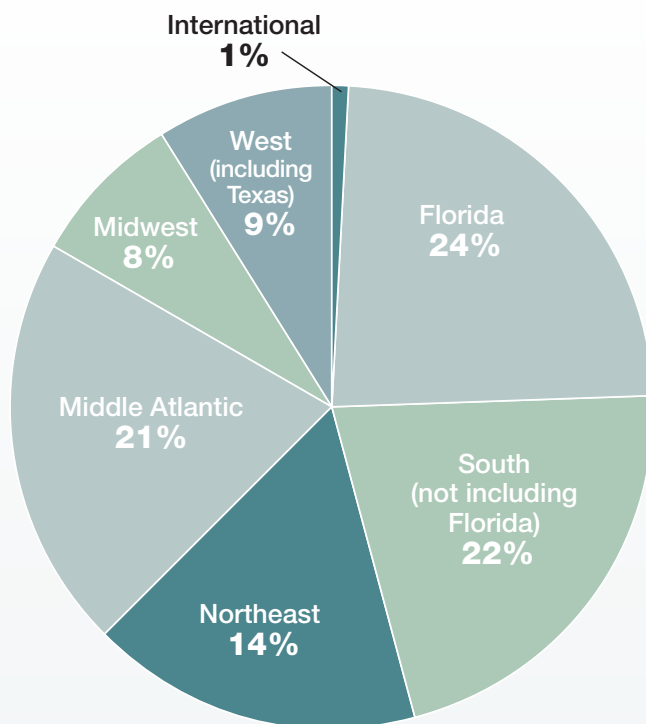
