Special Education-Extended School Year (ESY)

ESY programs are provided at no cost to parents on a year-round basis for students determined to be eligible in accordance with the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education whose disabilities require a structured learning environment of up to 12 months duration to prevent substantial regression.



Who is eligible for an extended school year (ESY) program?

In accordance with the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, CSE/CPSE students must be considered for ESY programs to prevent substantial regression if they are students:

- whose management needs are determined to be highly intensive and require a high degree of individualized attention and intervention and who are placed in special classes;
- with severe multiple disabilities, whose programs consist primarily of habilitation and treatment and are placed in special classes;
- who are recommended for home and/or hospital instruction whose special education needs are determined to be highly intensive and require a high degree of individualized attention and intervention or who have severe multiple disabilities and require primarily habilitation and treatment;
- whose needs are so severe that they can be met only in a seven-day residential program; or
- who are receiving other special education services and who, because of their disabilities, exhibit the need for a 12-month special service and/or program provided in a structured learning environment of up to 12-months duration in order to prevent substantial regression.



Coordinate Early Intervening Services (CEIS):

CEIS are services that are provided to assist students in kindergarten through grade 12 (with a particular emphasis on students in kindergarten through grade three) who are not currently identified as needing special education or related services, but who need additional academic and/or behavioral assistance. The intention is to have fewer and more appropriate referrals for special education services.
