Eight Grade Playcard Pre-visit Information Sheet

Grade 8: Biological Diversity, Adaptation, and Human Impact

Science Standards Addressed:

Biological Diversity as it relates to cyclic patterns of seasons. Energy flow and food webs. Adaptations and competition of limited resources. Human impact on biodiversity and ecosystem health. Environmental ethics (reduce, reuse, recycle) (8ESS1-1, LS2-4, LS4-2, LS2-7)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

Students will explore how cyclic patterns of seasons and geologic history affect organisms' growth and activity. Students will also learn about the flow of energy in a black-water swamp ecosystem by taking on the role of a wetland ecologist: They will explore, collect samples of organisms, and analyze adaptations of upland and wetland species. Human impacts to local ecosystems will be explored. Environmental ethics (reduce, reuse, recycle) are stressed as a way to conserve wetlands for future generations.

Post Visit Activity

As an assessment, each grade level is encouraged to create a learning, "feedback" project. You can analyze the different habitats around your own school for evidence of wetlands vs. uplands to discover whether your school was built on a wetland community. You may also web-quest the wetland conservation debate and section 404 of the Clean Water Act to enhance post visit connections.
