

APICI also aims to strengthen API family and community engagement and unity, and create a safe, supportive school environment that understands, respects, and advocates for the academic and social-emotional needs of all API students and families.

CAFE DAD

Cafe Dad is a space for fathers and father figures to meet, share resources, and obtain support for raising children in HUSD. This program is funded through Father Corps and is facilitated by HUSD male staff.



DISTRICT ENGLISH LEARNERS ADVISORY COMMITTEE (DELAC)®

The purpose of the HUSD District English Learners Advisory Committee (DELAC) is to serve as a forum for parents of English learners to advise District leadership and provide recommendations to the HUSD Board of Trustees on decisions concerning programs, services, and policies for English learners and their families.

OUTSTANDING PARENT VOLUNTEERS

HUSD Family Engagement Specialists work hand in hand with parent volunteers at the school sites. Outstanding parents are those that have gone above and beyond to help support their child's school and the organization of family engagement at the site level.

PARENT AMBASSADORS

The Parent Ambassador program, a partnership between HUSD and La Familia, is a representative body that acts as a liaison between the District and the parent community. The overall goal is to support the educational success of students and promoting parent voice & leadership. In addition, connection to health & wellness resources in the community.

SITE BASED DECISION MAKING

Site Based Decision Making (SBDM) was introduced to HUSD in 1996 as a strategy for ensuring that staff, parents, and students at individual school sites had a vehicle for engaging in the decision-making that most affected their own sites.
