Details about Summer School:

- Normandy Summer School will take place from Wednesday, June 5, 2024, through Wednesday, July 3, 2024.
- Normandy High School and students in grades 3, 4, and 5 will go from 7:30 am to 1:30 pm daily.
- Students in grades K, 1, and 2 and 6, 7, 8 will go from 8:30 am to 2:30 pm daily.
- Families will not be able to enroll their child(ren) after the start of Summer School.
- Families are only allowed to drop their child up to two days after the start of Summer School.

- No more than two absences will be permitted. Any student with more than two absences will not be allowed to continue NSC Summer School and earn credit or make progress in reading or mathematics.
- There will be no suspensions during NSC Summer School. Any student who is not following the NSC Code of Conduct will be dismissed from Summer School.


