Kyrus has long been a youth advocate teaching and assisting young people from a wide range of ethnic, cultural, and socioeconomic backgrounds. He holds a B.A. in Psychology and an M.B.A. in Health Services Administration. In his 7th year at LOGOS School, Kyrus continues his emphasis on creating trust and rapport to spark self-transformation and positive change.

What's special about LOGOS?

LOGOS offers an opportunity for some students to achieve a level of success that they may not have been able to achieve at their home school. Each student is treated as an individual with respect and LOGOS does not take a one-size-fits-all approach.

What is the impact of LOGOS School?

For the students, LOGOS shows them that they have a place in this world, that they can be seen for the person they are and not what is written about them on a document. For me, LOGOS has allowed me to embrace my gifts for teaching and coaching young people. LOGOS has shown me that my efforts to change the world, one kid at a time, will be supported. There is also an impact on the community at large that reminds us that it takes a village to help raise the youth. The community knows that there are people who work here who give their all each and every day to make the community a better place.

What sets LOGOS apart from other schools?

The way that our school is set up to function. LOGOS is a therapeutic and academic school. It has a small student population which allows us to not only help the student achieve success in the classroom but also achieve success in life, however that may look to that particular student.

What gives you hope?

My co-workers give me hope. They come into work every day and show love, compassion, and commitment towards the students even when those same students are not showing love in return. It reminds me that there are people in the world who have the same dedication to students that I have. And that I am not alone in this journey.

What advice do you have for youth today?

That there is nothing wrong with being afraid and taking chances. There will be times when things will not go your way and that is completely okay. Each day we have an opportunity to affect change in our lives and you have the strength to achieve it.

AMY LOTTES

LOGOS School, Director of Grant Management and Donor

Amy's passion for LOGOS School spans over 26 years starting with her role as Director of Development in the late 1990s to her current position as Director of Grant Management. Amy has a B.A. in Psychology and holds a Grant Professional Certification. She has over 30 years in nonprofit development including grant writing, research, major gifts, special events, board development, annual giving and on-line giving.

What's special about LOGOS for you?

There are so many things! It's the atmosphere when you walk in. There's just a vibrancy that's not necessarily missing in other schools, but it's just different because everybody here needs something in some way and all the staff are just here to help. I've never experienced that kind of passion and dedication and willingness to do whatever it takes to help a student get to where they need to be. And, you know, it's hard work but they work so hard and they love it and they love these kids. And you can just tell that everybody here cares.

After 26 years, what still gives you hope?

We're all here for a common goal and it's so much more than just teaching kids or giving kids therapy. It's working on the whole child and helping all of them and even helping the families because they're an integral part of this whole process, too. And that is the bond that brings all of the staff together, that we all have a shared focus, mission and passion for helping these kids. As the stigma of mental health has lessened, LOGOS has remained so true to their mission and purpose and has been so consistent with the caring and support that they give to the students. They do whatever it takes to help these kids succeed and have a successful life. Little things here and there have changed—we have more technology, a few more bells and whistles-but the fundamental part of LOGOS has never changed and that's helping kids.

Why give to LOGOS School?

Every dollar that is raised here helps a child, helps a child's family, helps impact life. People may think, "I don't have a kid that needs to be at LOGOS" or "I don't know anybody at LOGOS." But what they may not know is that every year when we have formal graduation, every graduate has the opportunity to speak on the stage (which normally doesn't happen at a traditional graduation) and it always impacts me that so many of the graduates say, "If it weren't for LOGOS, I wouldn't be here." And it's not 'here' on the stage they are referring to - it's 'here'- alive. And so donors who want their money to impact people, well, you can't have more of an impact than saving a child's life, even if it's one that you don't know. It has such a ripple effect because that child goes on to be successful, their family is stable, they get a job, they influence other people, they may have a family of their own. The ripple effect of helping one child at LOGOS is just enormous.

CLAIRE JENNINGS

LOGOS School, Alumna and Development Assistant

Claire graduated from LOGOS School in 2017 and went on to receive a B.A. in English, Professional Writing and Rhetoric and an M.A. in English Language and Literature. She is currently an English Adjunct Instructor as well as the new LOGOS School Development Assistant.

What made LOGOS special for you?

I loved everything about it — every single one of my teachers, staff, and all the therapists. Everyone came together as a team to love each student for who they were. It can be scary to transition into a new environment and everyone there is so welcoming and understanding of each struggle that someone is going through. There's a lot of patience and individualized attention that you don't see in a traditional school setting with a great deal of love and a sense of community and learning. Not only did I learn core subjects like math and history, but I learned how to manage my emotions and resolve problems on my own. LOGOS gave me the coping skills to move into the next stage of my life.

How did LOGOS School impact you?

If I hadn't gone to LOGOS, I wouldn't be doing any of the things I'm doing now. I teach English, and 10 years ago, I could never have envisioned myself standing up in front of a group of students. Even the thought of going to college was too scary of an idea for me, but through the love and support that I got at LOGOS, the skills that were taught to me, and the overall community, I felt a lot more confident to work my way to where I am now. I'm really proud of myself because I never would've envisioned myself being where I am working with people and students. As an educator, and because of LOGOS I have a good understanding for students going through a hard time.

Now as a teacher, how do you give hope?

In the very first class I had when I started teaching there were a couple of students who had accommodations and struggled a little bit, and I felt like I could relate to them and meet them where they were. Instead of being frustrated that things weren't getting turned in, I had the ability to reach out and say, "Hey, what's going on?" Before LOGOS this experience would have been terrifying for me, but now I find it really rewarding. Being in college can be difficult and I try to be mindful of that. I encourage students to work in groups a lot so that they talk to each other. Something I do now is I'll often tell students for the first few seconds of group work, if you need to talk about how much you hate it, just to get started talking, that's totally fine. Because I was a student who struggled, I give them strategies right out the gate to make it easier for themselves.


