



# No Man is an Island - The Story of Al Perkolup '43

What motivates some individuals to do something above and beyond the usual norms in any situation and thus, inspires us to alter our own behavior? Sometimes, it may only be another's words that inspire, but more often, it is the actions of those individuals that jostles our sensibilities as we then more clearly see that the actions of this individual are in sync with their words.

Al Perkolup from Roman's Class of 1943 is a wonderful example of this kind of inspirational leader, not only as a teenager, but later in his life as well. In two critical occasions in his short life, Al Perkolup demonstrated his true sense of self and his unselfish behavior.

The initial story of Al's unique life is told by a young Cahillite from the class of '44 - Andrew Cafagna. Cafagna was just a Junior at Catholic High when he wrote a story in 1943 for the *Purple & Gold* about an event that occurred in the Spring of '42. The story was titled *The Spirit of Catholic High*.

The principal character in Cafagna's story was Al Perkolup. Throughout that year, Perkolup had been the "stroke" of the crew team's varsity eight. But when the Catholic League Championship races were to begin on the Schuylkill River that spring, Al, Roman's best rower, was not going to be in that race. He was in the hospital in critical condition, the result of a hit-and-run car accident. Cafagna wrote that "the doctors questioned whether Al Perkolup would survive the week ahead."

The night before the big race, the team's coxswain, Art McArdle, visited the critically ill stroke of his team in the hospital. Cafagna didn't offer any content of what both men shared in that visit at this point, but he instead takes the reader to the following day and the CL Championship race between Catholic High and West Catholic. From the race's outset, without Al as their stroke, the crew from Broad & Vine fell way behind. Approaching the half mile marker,

the strong West eight was almost two boat lengths ahead of the Cahillites. Despite repeated taunts by Coxie McArdle to his exhausted rowers along the course's swollen currents, West's surging crew remained comfortably in the lead.

At this critical moment in the race, McArdle screamed to his crew as he appealed to the emotional side of the team. "Remember Al! Are you going to let Al down?"

McArdle then shouted out an order to the crew, as every crew does to this day, to row a "Power Ten." The command was for each rower to pull harder into the Schuykill's testy waters and at a faster pace for the next 10 strokes. As Carfagna tells it: "The crew of Cahillites picked up the pace and began to close in on the West Catholic boat...the Cahillite crew rowed with greater vigor rowing faster, faster, faster." The gap between the two boats narrowed. The Cahillites were on a mission – "to win one for Al."

As the two boats reached Peter's Island, very likely, both Coxies called for another "Power Ten" as both sprinted to reach the flag first. As Carfagna tells his story: "Then to the great surprise and astonishment of both team's supporters, the Cahillite crew reached the finish line scarcely five feet in front of the West Catholic boat."

To end his exciting and dramatic story, the author, Andrew Cafagna, waxed philosophical. With Perkolup back at stroke of the varsity 8-oared shell for his senior year, Cafagna suggested that his recovery was a reality that "no words can explain...now, (AI) had something to live for. Now, he owed Catholic High something – his life. He wanted to pay that debt back...in his senior year, AI Perkolup won every race he entered under the name of Catholic High...AI helped the team reclaim our national championship. Here is a loyal son of Catholic High... HE IS THE REAL SPIRIT OF CATHOLIC HIGH."



The second courageous, unselfish event in Al Perkolup's life would take place some three years later, and thousands of miles from home. It was the spring of 1945, and Al Perkolup was a U. S. Marine fighting on the island of Okinawa – the last great battle of WW II. The marines lost thousands of men in that battle. Al Perkolup was one of them. Combat

Correspondent George R. Voight of the Marine Corps wrote in the Philadelphia Inquirer: "It was his life or the lives of several marines. Private Perkolup knew that when he charged three Japanese soldiers sneaking through heavy under-brush, above Taira Bay, toward a group of unsuspecting Marines, he fired from his hip while he ran and killed two of the foe. He was cut down by the third soldier, who, later was killed by the Marines who were alerted by the shooting."

Perkolup was posthumously awarded the Bronze Star for bravery.

On November 9, 2023, nearly 80 years after Al Perkolup gave his life on Okinawa, there was a gathering at the historic 3rd floor gymnasium at Broad & Vine. It was Roman's annual Veterans Day Assembly, and several Cahillite military veterans, including Al Perkolup '43, were honored by the students and the alumni. Sitting among the attendees was a tearful Diane Perkolup, Al's sister. She had no idea that Roman still remembered and honored its fallen alumni,

and later wrote to the school: "It was a very emotional experience for me and made me appreciate all the more the great sacrifices not only that the honorees made but also that of their families. I also wanted to mention how impressed I was with the students. Every student I met was polite, respectful, thoughtful and generous in their offers to help us navigate the endless corridors and stairs to help us get to our several destinations. In every one, I saw young men of character who are destined to be successful adults, each one a reflection of the principles instilled in them at Roman."

You may ask yourself, how did such a young man of Al's age, possess an understanding about life that he had the courage to make the choices that he did - both as a teenager and as an adult? Certainly, at home, his own father's commitment to be of service to his community as a police detective played a part in the transference of values and concerns to protect others-in-need. But there can be no doubt that Catholic High played a pivotal role as well. As Al's sister so eloquently wrote, Al was "a reflection of the principles instilled in (him) at Roman."

A decade before Thomas Merton, Trappist monk, shared his thesis with the world: "No Man is an Island," Al Perkolup was already there. He was very familiar with the Second Commandment. He got it. He lived it. He died for it.

"Fides et Scientia" and "Semper Fi," Al.

# **EITC & OSTC Tax Credit Program**

### What is the tax credit?

The state tax credit program allows both businesses and individuals who pay Pennsylvania taxes to redirect their tax dollars to Roman Catholic High School in the form of tuition assistance and financial aid rather than the state government.

### How does it work?

There is a simple, one-page form that you can fill out. From there, Roman and an accredited scholarship organization will handle the rest. Once you are approved, you will submit your contribution to your assigned scholarship organization and earmark your gift for Roman Catholic High School. The scholarship organization will provide you a K1 in February which you will use when filing your taxes to process the credit or refund.

### How much is the tax credit?

For a one-year commitment, you will receive a tax credit for 75% of your contribution. For a two-year commitment, you will receive a tax credit for 90% of your contribution.

### What is the money used for?

All monies allocated to Roman Catholic High School are used to provide tuition assistance to families so that students can have a quality Catholic education.

EITC/OSTC are tremendous tools for Pennsylvania businesses and individual taxpayers to provide much needed tuition assistance to families who want to send their sons to Roman instead of these dollars being used at Harrisburg's discretion.

What were you involved in during your time at Roman? Band with the one and only Mr. John Stroud!

What have you been up to since you graduated from Roman? I went into the marketing industry for tech companies. I was a CMO for a leading management consulting business and then co-founded 2X where I am CEO. 2X is one of the fastest-growing marketing services companies in the world with nearly 1,000 employees.

### What do you feel makes Roman unique?

Its diverse student population. Growing up in South Philadelphia, you live the bulk of your life in a 5-block radius. You interact with people just like you and most inner-city high schools are just like that. Due to its location in Center City Philadelphia, Roman draws on a student population from all over the Philadelphia region – and brings students from all walks of life. Getting to really know peers from other backgrounds changes your worldview – it gives an understanding for the diverse city and country we live in, and the importance of embracing those differences.

### Why do you give back to Roman?

Roman is a special place and gave so much to me. Growing up in an urban single-mother household without a father, Roman was one of my primary sources of positive male influence in my life. It was an

incredibly impactful education, and also where I learned that I wanted to go into the marketing profession (via a business class - thanks Mr. Shanahan!). There was also a point in my Roman education where my family was unable to pay my tuition, and I was likely going to drop out. A financial aid program at Roman, just like the scholarship program that is possible with the EITC program, kept me enrolled. I'm forever grateful for that.

### Why did you decide to participate in the EITC Program?

It is an excellent way to make an impact with PA state tax dollars that you are frankly going to pay anyway. The ability to have a near 10:1 impact on a gift to support deserving students at Roman is a cause worth acting on.

# What would you say to someone who is thinking about participating in the EITC program?

Just ask your tax accountant and/or your financial advisor about it! A lot of programs like this might seem complicated, but I was surprised to learn how well-known the program is in the advisor community and how many of my advisors' other clients were already using it. The process was not difficult, and knowing that it was a very common vehicle for making a gift to a K-12 school made it an easy decision.

### What is your vision for the future of Roman?

An educational institution that continues to turn boys into young men of character – and men that become leaders. A place that continues to build a lifetime love of learning and teaches the skills to excel in whatever path a Roman grad wants to achieve.

# **Roman Business Spotlight:**

# Vietnam Restaurant & Vietnam Café Philadelphia, PA



The Lai family was among the first wave of Vietnamese refugees who came to Philadelphia to build a life on hard work and entrepreneurship fueled by lemongrass-scented feasts. The founding couple, Nhu Lai and Thuyen Luu, fled Vietnam by boat with their eight children after being stripped of their sandal factory in 1978. After nearly a year in a Malaysian refugee camp, they arrived in Philadelphia in 1979, began with a grocery store, then quickly transitioned to a modest restaurant space in Chinatown in 1984.

By 2000, after handing the business over to their son, Benny, moving to a larger multi-floor space next door, and undergoing a decor makeover evoking French colonial accents, the family secured Vietnam's place as one of Philly's favorite date-night destinations for classic Vietnamese cuisine. From barbecue platters laden with grilled meats, stuffed grape leaves, and Philly's crispiest spring rolls, to nu'ô'c châm-splashed vermicelli bowls, fragrant noodle soups, lemongrass stir-fries, and clay pots sizzling with caramelized pork, Vietnam's kitchen has remained a model of consistency for decades.

A second branch in West Philadelphia, Vietnam Café, has become a neighborhood favorite there, too, while the family's neighboring market, Fu Wah, has become a standard-bearer for its bánh mì.

The James Beard Foundation announced the recipients of its 2024 America's Classics Award on February 29, 2024 and Vietnam Restaurant in Chinatown is honored to be a recipient of that award.

Years ago, when a young man felt the call to the Priesthood, he was able to complete his Junior and Senior Years of High School at Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary and then proceed to the Seminary College & Graduate School of Theology.

So, young men came from various schools throughout the Archdiocese such as Cardinal Dougherty, Father Judge, Northeast Catholic, St. Joseph's Prep, and West Catholic. However, when they completed the two years of High School at Saint Charles, they were granted a High School Diploma from Roman Catholic High School.

Well, Archbishop Edward J. Adams, was one such student. He entered Saint Joseph's Prep in the Fall of 1958 and two years later entered Saint Charles Seminary to complete his high school courses, which he did in the Spring of 1962. However, for some reason, he never received his High School Diploma from Roman Catholic.

That oversight was finally corrected.
Following the Confirmation Liturgy at Saint Helena's in Blue Bell, Principal Mr. John Curry and Rector Emeritus, Father Joseph W. Bongard '77, bestowed the Diploma of Roman Catholic High School on Archbishop Adams and formally accepted him as a member of the RCHS Class of 1962.
