LEARNING SNAPSHOT

Year 1 have really enjoyed their Judaism topic in RE. On Monday they enjoyed a visit from Rabbi Zvi. He taught the children about the importance of Shabbat and the Shabbat meal. The children also enjoyed trying some Challa bread and grape juice and said the Shabbat blessing.

Year 2 have continued learning about time in maths, with a focus on telling the time to 5 minute intervals. In literacy, we have been researching and writing information about tigers. We have also been practising the basics, such as capital letters and full stops. In history, we have started learning about Henry VIII. We have also been sharing our home learning projects with the class and it has been wonderful work to see that we have all done!

Year 3 had an amazing last half-week of term! In orienteering (PE), we used our map reading skills to create our own maps for treasure-hunting. We were lucky to walk over to Stovell Fields to take part in a Cricket Festival with other schools. It was amazing participating in the carousel of activities provided by the Windsor Sports Partnership! In English, we freeze-framed a scene from our class novel 'The Great Kapok Tree' using persuasive language and then debated respectfully 'for and against' deforestation.

Year 4 wrote their mummification instructions. To help them to remember the key parts of the process, they mummified Barbie and Ken dolls. In Science the children made circuits with switches before designing and making their own switch. This was part of the Express Event. It was lovely to see the parents helping the children with their switches and marvelling at the speed, at which, the children were able to set up a circuit and make a bulb light. In PE, Year 4 played baseball for the first time. Having just received new equipment, they are looking forward to their weekly baseball lesson after half term.

Reception had an exciting visitor this week from Richard, a local vet. He brought some patients with him and explained what instruments he uses for different situations. The children had lots of questions and then enjoyed watching his tortoises explore the classroom and eating a snack which was a lovely way to finish off this term's projects.

Ask me: What did you find out about Richard's job?





Mrs Dewar was very impressed that children from Year 1 to Year 4 were able to double numbers, to work out how many rabbits were in the field. Nora, in Year 4, identified the Fibonacci sequence which

enabled the children to calculate how many pairs of rabbits were in the field each month.
