CSDA Happenings

Grade 4: Fourth graders are immersed in reading poetry and beginning to write down ideas and lines for developing their own poems. They are learning about stanzas, stanza breaks, slant rhymes, alliteration, and repetition. Social Studies classes continue to delve into the NH Industries that were fed by waves of immigration in the 1820's and beyond.

Grade 5: Fifth graders are learning about fossils and chemical matter in their Amplify CKLA Reading experience. In Social Studies, students are continuing to learn about the American Revolution.

Grade 6: Sixth graders have been working on a few writing pieces relating to elementary school memories to end the school year. Some are in the form of poetry, some written as a "remember when..." question for their classmates. We are excited to choose a few to share at our sixth grade promotion ceremony! CSDA Unified Arts: In physical education students are participating in a "Soft" Lacrosse unit. Students will be introduced to skills such as stick handling, passing, shooting and basic goalie techniques. Classes will finish the unit with some modified game play.

RMMS Happenings

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Pre-K: Preschoolers have enjoyed watching their butterfly metamorphosis. Next week, they will begin their final unit on the farm and start working on end-of-the-year t-shirts.

Grade K: Kindergarteners are working hard as they compose shapes! They are using more spatial awareness skills they explore which shapes fit into each other and how.

Grade 1: First graders will begin their geometry unit in math. Students will learn about the attributes of 2D and 3D shapes. First graders will also learn about the suffix -es in Fundations.

Grade 2: Second graders will be incorporating addition and subtraction into their measurement study in math. In reading, they will continue to investigate how characters can change and develop over time throughout a series.

Grade 3: Third graders are writing their scripts and practicing for their Wax Museum presentations. They are shifting from equivalent fractions to volume and measurement in math and focusing on animal adaptions in science.

RMMS Unified Arts: In PE class students are wrapping up the year with striking activities. Their focus is on paddles and performing the underhand strike. In health, classes are working on summer safety.

Seasonal Allergies-**Keeping Symptoms** in Check



Symptoms include: congestion-sneezing-itchy eyes, nose, and throat-post nasal drip-fatiguecough Discuss a treatment plan with your child's doctor for the best relief/treatment options. If your child is experiencing symptoms, please administer medication at home. We DO NOT have over the counter oral allergy medication or allergy eye medication at school. If your child may need additional medication during the school day, contact the nurse for the forms needed to provide other medication to administer at school. After being outside, remind your child to wash their hands and face to remove surface pollen.






HELP WANTED!!!
