Mr. Weaver thanked the Borough of Montvale for the Shared Services Agreement for the SLEO IIIs. He indicated that it's a significant resource that provides safety to both schools. He thanked both Montvale and Hillsdale.

XII. OLD BUSINESS

Monthly Suspension Report (attached)

Ms. Bilotti commented on the following:

ADV Bergen County Workshop

The Alternatives to Domestic Violence workshop that Elizabeth Calderone has mentioned at prior meetings is being hosted by the Hills Valley Coalition on May 8th and is called building healthy relationships, a parent's guide to recognizing and addressing teen dating violence. You can find information in Parent Square or on the Hills Valley Coalition social media.

Referendum

As I mentioned, we have asked our senior admin team to begin to identify priorities for us to consider for a possible budget-neutral referendum in 2028. Yas has asked them to consider priorities outside of cost at this juncture so that we may get a clear picture of needs and assess from there. To that end at our May meeting we will have our architect discuss with the Board the first step of a referendum process which is a full facility use evaluation, he will also discuss potential timelines and expectations for referendum planning. At that same meeting he will respond to the request for a room utilization study with regard to the locker rooms, specifically.

Cell Tower

We have been in contact with the townships around Valley and understand that cell towers are being constructed that may impact our service at Valley. We engaged in a study which will also be presented at the April 29th Board meeting with some alternatives for us to consider should cell towers not yield additional cell signals.

Budget

We are working to schedule a Finance Committee meeting between now and the budget adoption to go over the budget and also to hear from the athletic directors regarding not just boosters but also the overall changes to the athletic budget, which are outlined in the memo that Yas will pass out right now. This memo includes additional information about the budget process and we ask that you let us know prior to the budget hearing any specific questions that you may have. We will have a full presentation at the April 29th meeting as well.

Mr. Weaver said it's difficult for a board member who is not on the Finance Committee to understand everything going into the budgeting process since the budget increase is voted on at one meeting and then adoption takes place at a later meeting. It makes it difficult to ask questions. He mentioned that other districts give a presentation of the budget which allows for questions and the budget is voted on at another meeting. He indicated that at the last meeting it was mentioned that three positions are not going to be filled due to declining enrollment. He would like to know the positions, why are the positions not needed and what do the enrollment decreases look like. He said it could have been discussed prior to the vote of the tentative budget. Ms. Bilotti indicated that information will be provided to the Finance Committee as well as the full board. Ms. Bilotti characterized the three positions as being absorbed. She commented that there are sections that are not full and as sectioning proceeds there could be the possibility of having one teacher rather than two. She mentioned that out of the 11 retirements and resignations. they will need backfill about nine of them. She said it does not mean that something will be cut or not running things. It's due to fewer students signing up for courses. She gave an example of Chinese language where there are fewer students signing up for it, so it appears that two teachers with a full load will not be needed and one teacher could teach other classes. She said this approach would provide flexibility in scheduling and staffing without a direct impact to student services.

Mr. Weaver asked what are the other two positions.

Ms. Bilotti indicated that Guidance is working on finalizing the sectioning report. She mentioned that other areas with fewer students signed up are French, Italian, performing music courses, and electives. She commented that those courses are still being run, but it may be with fewer staff. Mr. Weaver said the new schedule was to provide consistency of the days and to offer electives. He asked if there has been an increase in electives taken, a survey for students on what electives they would like to take, has there been an increase in elective offerings.

Mr. Stankus asked if there is enough flexibility to accommodate what students want. He indicated that from year to year students' preferences change as well as demographics. He wants to make sure that those factors are considered when making decisions.

Mr. Weaver asked to accommodate these needs. Are there other areas besides teaching staff to cut from?

Ms. Stephans, Mrs. Varghese commented that the positions are not being filled. They are not being fired.

Mr. Weaver said it's semantics - absorbed/eliminated. He gave an example of 100 teachers and now there are 97 then there are three fewer teachers. He wants to make sure that the new schedule is being met by expanding offerings/providing more opportunities. He would like to know if that goal has been met. He asked if the district is doing enough to provide trade offerings. He would like to see if there is data on what student elective offerings they want. He would like to know how many students are taking electives versus a study hall for their Pascack Period. He mentioned that the three positions would equal about \$300,000, so where would that savings come from if not the teaching positions. He commented that in the future it would be helpful to have the budget information at the earlier meeting in advance of the final vote. He would like more information on the budget especially when the master schedule is to provide more offerings for students.

Ms. Stephans commented that if Mr. Weaver heard from the directors, his questions will be answered. She said the business courses have been expanded and there are plenty of electives. She indicated that they are listening to the students.

Ms. Bilotti indicated that they are not eliminating programs or reducing electives by absorbing positions. She said they are looking at students' needs and desires. She mentioned that it is not beneficial for students to be in a small class size. She indicated that there are 180 fewer students since 2020 and that is why fewer teachers are needed. She commented that since 2021 the elective offerings have increased as students were allowed to take two electives.

Mrs. Martin commented that a big change is the growth of the internship program. She mentioned that speaks to the trades. She also mentioned that those students leave in the afternoon to go to their internships.

Ms. Bilotti mentioned that there appears to be 50 fewer students based on outgoing seniors and incoming freshmen. She said the decline is not perpetual since the sending districts are experiencing an increase especially in pre-k to grades 2. She indicated that scheduling is an ongoing process and it takes time because the administration tries to accommodate students' wants. She mentioned that she has been in other districts where students rank their courses and they are given courses based on efficiency of scheduling. If they cannot be accommodated then other options such as online, virtual high school, and dual enrollment with colleges. She commented that another option is to utilize 6th period assignment to provide a course if the other options are not possible. She said when enrollment increases the restructuring that has been done will afford them to keep the programs and expand if needed. She anticipates an upswing in vocal and performing arts since the middle school band numbers are substantially larger than two years ago due to Covid.

Mrs. Huang said certain electives have varying weighting of grades. She commented that it could hurt a student's GPA. She asked why they are weighted differently and it could have an impact on which elective is chosen.

Ms. Bilotti indicated that Dr. Bachenheimer and his team are evaluating it.

Mr. Stankus said he likes this discussion. He mentioned the college and career readiness skills which is required by the state and the district is doing a superb job. He commented that the district is a member of the League of Innovative Schools, so the district is always looking to bring in innovative and cutting edge ideas. He indicated that everything is moving at an exponential speed. He commented that high school graduates today will have different jobs available to them when they graduate college. He tells students to go into something they are passionate about. He said flexibility is important, so when something is in high demand then a teacher can be moved if qualified and if something is low demand then move the teacher to something in high demand. He said the environment is ever changing.

Mrs. Varghese appreciated Mr. Weaver's perspective and bringing this up. She indicated that the Board has a financial fiscal responsibility, so if a class can be combined utilizing one teacher instead of two then that is fiscally responsible.

Mr. Weaver asked, with budgeting becoming increasingly more difficult, will the district be able to build positions back in time.

Mr. Usami acknowledged that budgets are more difficult. He said that with increased enrollment then the state provides an enrollment adjustment that other districts have experienced and received. This does mean that the increase will go above 2%, but there is a reason for that (enrollment increase). He added that state aid should increase as well, however that is not always a given. He referenced S2 which has provided under funded districts like our district with

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additional state aid for seven years. This is coming to an end. The increase for the district has not been as large due to enrollment decrease. He added that efficiency with staffing is important.
