IV. ROUTINE MATTERS

Superintendent's Report: Sarah Bilotti thanked Dr. Bachenheimer and his team for the curriculum updates.

Pascack Valley and Pascack Hills High Schools hosted middle school festivals for students coming from our sending middle schools. The teachers from both schools, Margarita Elkin and Catherine Corcoran, along with their counterparts from middle schools, put together a varied program of songs that culminated in combined performances with middle school choirs. Everyone involved truly enjoyed the events, and middle schoolers got inspired to join our music programs in the future.

Pascack Hills English teacher Heather Lutz has been rewriting the curriculum for the New Jersey Commission on Holocaust Education.

PV English teacher Val Santo recently hosted Holocaust survivor Mark Schonwetter and his daughter, Isabella Fiske, as a guest speaker to tell his family's important survival story to students and staff.

Ken Sarajian will be presenting at the Holocaust and Armenian Genocide Commemoration event at the Hudson County Community College on April 25th along with Mark Schonwetter (the Holocaust survivor Val Santo hosted @PV)

Argine Safari was part of a panel of NJ Teachers of the Year at the State Conference for Teacher Recruitment and Retention held at Montclair State University on Tuesday. The conference was attended by administrators, New Jersey legislators, teachers, professors, and non profit leaders from around the state.

Valerie Mattessich, District Supervisor of English, Art & Libraries, in her continued role as President of the New Jersey Council of Teachers of English, will be presenting the opening speech at the organization's annual Spring conference on April 29 at The College of New Jersey.

Dr. Alexandra Pfleging, Pascack Hills English teacher, recently published an article in the National Council of Teachers of English *English Journal*, a national, peer-reviewed journal for high school English educators.

Bond Refunding Report: Yas Usami

Mr. Usami reported that the bond market looks good for a refunding (refinancing) of the outstanding bonds. The requirement to refund the bonds is a minimum of a net 3% savings. Currently, it stands at 4.1% which is about \$70,000 per year savings from the debt service portion of the tax bill. An RFP for an underwriter is in progress. A ratings

call is also required and unfortunately if a sale is not completed, the district is required to pay the fee. The financial consultant indicated that the agency may discount their fee by 30% if the sale is not completed. The sale should occur about mid to late May and the closing in June. The length of the term cannot be shortened or lengthened in a bond refunding.
