#### X. OLD BUSINESS

Policy Committee Report

Mr. Stankus, the chair, was absent. Dr. Fishbein indicated that the policies on tonight's agenda were discussed. A change in verbiage from "shall" to "must" was made in one policy.

Mr. Weaver raised a facilities and finance question related to equity in facilities specifically with the girl's locker room at Hills. He mentioned that at a Facilities Committee meeting it was discussed that a plan would be developed and he asked about the status of the plan and the funding and purpose.

Dr. Fishbein indicated that there are funds for the development of a plan with professionals in the upcoming budget. He said it depends on how the Board would like to fund this project. He mentioned that if this project were to be part of a larger referendum, then the upfront cost for some preliminary drawings would not be as much as detailed drawings which would be done through a passage of a referendum.

Mr. Weaver commented that the problem is that presently there are no options available to the Board. He indicated that an architect would need to be employed to get those options with costs associated with each for a budget to be developed. He is frustrated that it's been about a year since this has been discussed. He mentioned that the Equity Committee has not met in a about a year and this topic was to be discussed at the committee. This has been ignored as a Board.

Dr. Fishbein did not think it was ignored. He mentioned that at committee it was discussed that gutting the locker room would not make it equitable. There needs to be an addition.

Mr. Weaver indicated that survey data from a year ago have not been acted upon. He asked when this will move forward. He said that finances cannot be determined until a plan is developed.

Mr. Blundo asked what the cost of an architect would be for a plan and could this be supported by next year's budget.

Dr. Fishbein commented that it could be funded. It's conceptual and not detailed, so it's not as costly.

Mr. Weaver asked how much a detailed plan would cost. He mentioned the allocation of \$1 million each for an auditorium renovation at the two schools. Mr. Usami clarified that it's \$1.3 million for each school. He said if \$2.6 million can be allocated for much needed auditorium renovations then would it be possible to fund a girl's locker room or would there be a need to go out for a referendum.

Dr. Fishbein mentioned that the conceptual drawing will provide an estimated range of cost.

Mr. Weaver asked how much is budgeted for this conceptual plan and when this will occur.

Mr. Usami commented that he did not have an amount at this time. He indicated that the budget has funds for architects and engineers to explore projects like this. He mentioned that the Facilities Director is scheduling a meeting with the principals to begin planning.

Mr. Weaver asked what the purpose is of the Equity Committee.

Mrs. Martin commented that the committee was focused on a different subject before the girl's locker room came up.

Dr. Blundy commented that a schedule for meeting dates were communicated in the past. She suggested that the superintendent search is over then the Equity Committee could meet to address this issue.

Mr. Weaver asked if open-ended questions will be part of the survey.

Dr. Blundy indicated that at the last meeting Dr. Russo gave a presentation regarding the survey. He mentioned the questions that will be asked will be shared, opt out options and results of the survey to the Board.

Mr. Blundo said that Dr. Fishbein could find out if open-ended questions will be on the survey. He mentioned that Mr. Weaver has been a champion of the girl's locker room from the start and he asked that it be put in the front of the new fiscal year with conceptual drawings, so the Board will have an idea of cost.

Mr. Weaver commented that the locker room has been something that the students have been asking for a long time.

Mr. Blundo asked if the equity issue is between boys and girls locker rooms or also between the two schools.

Mr. Weaver said it's also between the two schools.

Mr. Weaver indicated that at a Facilities Committee meeting it was determined that the track did not need to be replaced. Now in the Briefing it mentioned that the track needs to be replaced.

Dr. Fishbein said that the track does need to be replaced, however there was a question about replacing the track while preserving the drainage issues underneath the stands.

Mr. Blundo asked if the track may be used.

Mr. Usami indicated that it may be used with some repairs. He commented that the engineer still stands by his opinion that the track may be used with repairs. He indicated that students and coaches feel the track is too hard and would like it replaced. He said that they are finalizing a contract with a company through one of the NJ pricing cooperatives to have the work done this summer. He added that the track replacement is in the current budget, but it had been postponed due to the erosion issues under the grandstand. He hopes to have a resolution for the Board to approve at the next meeting.

#### XI. NEW BUSINESS

Mrs. Martin congratulated the students of Pascack Valley Pascack Hills USA Student Skills Competition who performed very well in the first stage and are moving on.
