## 9. Award Bid for Pascack Hills Parking Lot Stair Replacement

WHEREAS, the Pascack Valley Regional High School District Board of Education ("Board") advertised twice for bids for the Parking Lot Stair Replacement Project at Pascack Hills High School ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, on each occasion, the Board rejected bids for the Project as exceeding the cost estimates and budget for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Board authorized the Business Administrator/Board Secretary and the Architect to negotiate a contract pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-5; and

WHEREAS, all bidders who submitted bids for the project on the second occasion were advised of the Board's intention to negotiate and were afforded a reasonable opportunity to do so; and

WHEREAS, negotiations were conducted with all interested contractors; and

WHEREAS, Tri-Plex Industries, Inc. ("Tri-Plex") submitted the lowest negotiated bid price for the Project, including a base bid in the amount of \$89,700, together with Scope Modification No. 1 (reduce maintenance bond to 1 year), a deduction in the amount of \$1,000, Scope Modification No. 2 (performing work during regular business hours), a deduction in the amount of \$1,000, and Scope Modification No. 3 (provide alternate handrail design), a deduction in the amount of \$4,200; and;

WHEREAS, Tri-Plex submitted a material responsive negotiated bid, and it is the Board's desire to award the contract for the Project to Tri-Plex.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board hereby awards the contract for the Project in a negotiated sum of \$83,500, which includes Scope Modifications Nos. 1, 2, and 3.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the award is expressly conditioned upon the Contractor furnishing the requisite insurance certificate, performance bond, AA-201 Project Manning Reporting, and executed contracts, as prepared by the Board Attorney, within ten (10) days of the date hereof.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board Attorney is hereby directed to draft the agreement with the successful contractor consistent with this Resolution and with the terms contained in the bid documents approved by the Board for the Project. The Board President and the Board Secretary are hereby authorized to execute such agreements and any other documents necessary to effect the terms of this Resolution.

#### X. OLD BUSINESS

Health, Wellness, and Safety Committee Report

In absence of Mr. Hallowell, the chair of the committee, Dr. Gundersen gave a report. He mentioned that the Wellness Center has been functioning during the COVID era. He said that Dr. Myers, School Psychologist has worked on strategies to engage students on proper therapies and the use of outside sources. He mentioned that Jennifer Zimmerman, the Student Assistance Counselor has focused on the Week of Respect, Red Ribbon and the Hills Valley Coalition to assist with student wellness. Alyssa Merritt, the Regional Curriculum and Instruction Coach is working with the principals and curriculum personnel of the K-8 sending districts on wellness initiatives for student and staff to improve social and emotional learning experiences.

Ms. Molinelli asked about the principal search and the mascot selection process timelines.

Dr. Gundersen said the two Athletic Directors are leading the mascot selection process and either they or committee members (students) will speak to the Board at the December board meeting. A recommendation will come to the Board in January. He reported that the Pascack Valley principal search process will begin in December. He will establish protocols and procedures with the Board. The search process will run from late January to early March. This is a similar timeline as last year.

Ms. Molinelli asked about the status of the bees.

Dr. Gundersen reported that some board members received their honey.

Mr. Steinberg said the honey is very good and he is looking forward to more next year.

#### XI. NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Scher said that the Pascack Valley High School Theater will perform Brothers Grimm from November 19-21. This will be streamed online. Mr. Scher noticed that some districts have upgraded their field lights to LED. He asked about the possibility to do the same in the district and if Mr. Donahue, Director of Facilities and Capital Improvement could be consulted on the subject.

Dr. Gundersen indicated that the parking lot lights are LED. He commented that the field lights are older and other districts may have recently upgraded their fields along with the lights. He added that he will confer with Mr. Donahue as he is always looking for cost savings.

Mr. Scher mentioned that since there are no concession sales that assists the graduating class, would the district be inclined to assist.

Dr. Gundersen said he will ask the principals if the senior classes are in dire need of fundraising.

Mr. Scher commented that the new board should consider changing the district name to Pascack Regional to be inclusive of both Valley and Hills.

Mr. Stankus raised a concern about the increase in COVID cases as the state average is 39.7 cases per 100,000 and Bergen County is 35 cases per 100,000. The Harvard Global Health Institute recommends schools going virtual if over 25 cases per 100,000. He cited that the state average was 18 cases/100,000 on November 1<sup>st</sup>. This could potentially double the hospitalization to 5,000 in the next two weeks. He understands that decisions to go virtual is coordinated with the Board of Health and orders by the Governor. He believes that local, county and state officials should safeguard our community. He added that the schools are doing well as they have been following the guidelines.

Mr. Steinberg thanked the teachers and staff for showing up and working.

Mr. Scher likened the schools to be more like a dimmer than a light switch. He said the district has done a good job during this time. The district has dimmed when necessary.

Mr. Stankus said the district has done a remarkable job with technology, keeping the schools open, contact tracing, and social distancing. He mentioned that the students follow the guidelines when they are in school. He added that the district has done all that can be done and everything right.

### XII. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilman Chris Roche of Montvale wanted to know what Montvale could do.

Mr. Stankus said it's more at the state and county level to do something to stem the increase in hospitalizations that affect the community hospitals.

Mr. Roche said he will check with the mayor. He asked about the possibility of live streaming classes.

Dr. Gundersen indicated that streaming has been going on for a while. He mentioned that all classes have the ability to live stream, however some classes are more conducive to live streaming than others. This is determined by the teachers.

Mr. Scher said that Montvale put out a video regarding the census in 16 different languages. He suggested a PSA on social distancing in those different languages.

Chloe Djedji, a student from Montvale thanked the four non-returning board members. She asked if they believe they were not re-elected due to the mascot decision.

Ms. Molinelli responded that Chloe may reach out to each board member. She suggested entering her contact information in the chat function to share with those board members.

Dr. Gundersen responded that Chloe could reach out to him and he would assist her in contacting those board members.

Ms. Molinelli commented that it has been a long 2 ½ months and it has been difficult on the community, students, teachers, leaders, and board members. She said the school district and community are remarkable. She urged everyone to work together to serve the community. She added her gratitude to everyone.

## XIII. ADJOURNMENT
