#### 6. N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24.1 Code of Ethics for School Board Members

The President read aloud the following code of ethics which applies to all School Board Members:

School Board Members shall abide by the following Code of Ethics for School Board Members:

I will uphold and enforce all laws, rules and regulations of the State Board of Education, and court orders pertaining to schools. Desired changes shall be brought about only through legal and ethical procedures.

I will make decisions in terms of the educational welfare of children and will seek to develop and maintain public schools that meet the individual

needs of all children regardless of their ability, race, creed, sex, or social standing.

I will confine my board action to policy making, planning, and appraisal, and I will help to frame policies and plans only after the board has consulted those who will be affected by them.

I will carry out my responsibility, not to administer the schools, but, together with my fellow board members, to see that they are well run.

I will recognize that authority rests with the board of education and will make no personal promises nor take any private action that may compromise the board.

I will refuse to surrender my independent judgment to special interest or partisan political groups or to use the schools for personal gain or for the gain of friends.

I will hold confidential all matters pertaining to the schools which, if disclosed, would needlessly injure individuals or the schools. In all other matters, I will provide accurate information and, in concert with my fellow board members, interpret to the staff the aspirations of the community for its school.

I will vote to appoint the best qualified personnel available after consideration of the recommendation of the chief administrative officer.

I will support and protect school personnel in proper performance of their duties.

I will refer all complaints to the chief administrative officer and will act on the complaints at public meetings only after failure of an administrative solution.

# 7. Appointment of Professional Services

WHEREAS, funds are available to obtain such professional services, and

WHEREAS, the Public School Contract Law N.J.S.A. 18A: 18A-5 authorizes the awarding of contracts for professional services by resolution of the Board of Education without publicly advertised competitive bids.

**ACCORDINGLY**, the Pascack Valley Regional High School District Board of Education authorizes the award of the following professional services appointments and contracts:

- a. That the firm of <u>Fogarty & Hara</u>, Counsellors at Law, Fair Lawn, NJ, be appointed Board of Education attorneys to provide legal services until the next reorganization meeting, at fees negotiated for each individual project, and as per the following hourly rates: \$175 for a partner and \$155 for an associate. There is no increase in the hourly rates.
- b. That the firm of Nisivoccia LLP, Mt. Arlington, NJ, be appointed Board of Education auditors and accountants to provide auditing and accounting services until the next reorganization meeting, at fees negotiated for each individual project, and as per the following hourly rates: \$165 \$185 for a partner, \$140 \$165 in-charge and \$95 \$130 staff. The fee for the audit is \$47,632.
- c. That the firm of Environetics Group Architects, PC, Englewood Cliffs, NJ, be appointed Board of Education architects to provide architectural services until the next reorganization meeting, at fees negotiated for each individual project, at the following hourly rates: \$160 for principals, \$150 for associate principals, \$145 for senior project managers, and \$125 for project manager. Please see attached list for additional fees. There is no increase in the hourly rates.
- d. That the firm of <u>AHERA</u> Consultants, Inc., Oceanville, NJ be appointed Board of Education asbestos consulting service until the next reorganization meeting, at fees negotiated for each individual project, at the following hourly rates: \$65 for asbestos inspector and \$100 for project designer. Please see attached list for additional fees.
- e. That the firm of <u>KSI</u> Consulting Engineers, LLC, Farmingdale, NJ, be appointed Board of Education engineers until the next reorganization meeting, at fees negotiated for each individual project, at the following hourly rates: \$180 for principal consultant and \$155 project manager/senior engineer. Please see attached list for additional fees.
- f. That the firm of <u>Wilentz</u> Attorneys at Law, Woodbridge, NJ, be appointed Board of Education bond counsel until the next reorganization meeting, at fees negotiated for each individual project, at the following hourly rates: \$215 for attorney time. Please see attached list for additional fees.
- g. That <u>Dr. Michelle Mayer</u>, Woodcliff Lake, NJ be appointed Board of Education school physician until the next reorganization meeting, at the yearly fee of \$10,000.
- h. That <u>Dr. Shawn Trokhan</u>, Closter, NJ be appointed Board of Education school athletic physician at PVHS until the next reorganization meeting, at the yearly fee of \$3,000.
- i. That <u>Dr. Oscar Vazquez</u>, Hoboken, NJ be appointed Board of Education school athletic physician at PHHS until the next reorganization meeting, at the yearly fee of \$3,000.

These professional services contracts are made and awarded without competitive bidding as the services will be rendered by persons experienced in the practice of a process requiring specialized knowledge and resources.

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that Board member participation in the NJSBAC and BCSBA promotes the delivery of instruction and furthers the efficient operation of the Pascack Valley Regional High School District; and

# 15. Approval of Maximum Travel and Related Expenditures

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:11-12, in each pre-budget year, the Pascack Valley Regional High School District Board of Education is required to establish a maximum travel expenditure amount for the budget year which may not be exceeded; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has determined that the maximum travel expenditure amount includes all travel that is supported by state and local funds; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Education had previously established a maximum amount for the pre-budget year 2020-2021 as \$180,000.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has expended \$1,098 of the maximum amount for the pre-budget year to date; and

**RESOLVED**, that the Pascack Valley Regional High School District Board of Education hereby establish the maximum travel expenditure amount for the 2021-2022 school year as \$180,000.

#### 16. Annual Travel Pre-Authorization

Child Study Team members who travel to meetings and other events as required by their job description will be reimbursed for their mileage at the NJ OMB Circular established rate; Technology Department employees who travel to meetings and other events as required by their job description will be reimbursed for their mileage at the NJ OMB Circular established rate;

Region II employees who travel to meetings and other events as required by their job description will be reimbursed for their mileage at the NJ OMB Circular established rate;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the aforementioned district employees will be reimbursed for travel related expenses at the designated 2021-2022 payment periods, in compliance with state statutory and federal regulatory requirements, not to exceed \$1,500 per employee for regular business travel.

# 18. Authorize Participation in the New Jersey State Health Benefits Program

A RESOLUTION to authorize participation in the State Health Benefits Program and/or School Employees' Health Benefits Program of the State of New Jersey.

#### BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. The Pascack Valley Regional Board of Education hereby elects to participate in the Health Program provided by the New Jersey State Health Benefits Act of the State of New Jersey (N.J.S.A. 52:14-17.26 and N.J.S.A. 52:14-17.46.2) and to authorize coverage for all the employees and their dependents thereunder in accordance with the statute and regulations adopted by the State Health Benefits Commission and/or School Employees' Health Benefits Commission.
- 2. We elect to participate in the Employee Prescription Drug Plan defined by N.J.S.A. 52:14-17.25 et seq. and authorize coverage for all employees and their dependents in accordance with the statute and regulations adopted by the State Health Benefits Commission and/or School Employees' Health Benefits Commission.
- 3. We will be maintaining Delta as our dental plan.
- 4. We elect 30 hours per week (average) as the minimum requirement for full time status in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:9-4.6.
- 5. As a participating employer we will remit to the State Treasury all charges due on account of employee and dependent coverage and periodic charges in accordance

with the requirements of the statute and the rules and regulations duly promulgated thereunder.

- 6. We hereby appoint Yas Usami, Business Administrator to act as Certifying Officer in the administration of this program.
- 7. This resolution shall take effect immediately and coverage shall be effective as soon thereafter as it may be effectuated pursuant to the statutes and regulations (can be no less than 75 or 90 days pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 17:9-1.4).

# 19. Approval of Maximum Public Relations and Professional Services Expenditures

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:23-5.2 (a), 1 the Board of Education shall establish in the annual school budget a maximum expenditure amount that may be allotted for public relations and each type of professional service for 2021-2022 school year.

#### XI. OLD BUSINESS

Dr. Gundersen mentioned that a student representative from each school will report on the progress of the mascot selection process at the next meeting and recommendations will be made at the second February meeting.

Dr. Gundersen said that child care for staff held at Pascack Hills High School is going quite well. The cost is funded by the staff utilizing the service.

Dr. Gundersen indicated that the board members will be receiving an email about selecting their top three committees they would like to serve. Typically, members serve on more than two committees. He said that a lot of work takes place at the committee level. Members interact with faculty, administrators, students, and parents depending on the committee.

Dr. Gundersen said the early elementary education program is for 3-5-year olds. This program was suspended this year; however, it is anticipated that the program will operate next year. He indicated that the resident was informed.
