#### VII. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC – BUDGET ITEMS ONLY

Citizens are invited to make comments regarding budget items and are limited to five minutes, according to the Pascack Valley Regional High School District Board of Education policy number 0167. Persons wishing to speak must, upon being recognized, rise and state their name and address.

Carolee Adams of Montvale congratulated Ms. Stephans. She asked if the budget could be tabled until the public could view detail numbers. She believed that tenured appointments should have the names, positions and salaries listed. She asked the Board to consider a lesser amount for the superintendent who may not be a long-term district employee thus result in a reduction in the budget. She asked if there is consideration of reducing the budget since FEMA announced full reimbursement for not only cost of equipment/tools involved with COVID-19, but for overtime work.

Dr. Gundersen indicated that the tenured staff approval is to indicate who will be coming back next year. He offered to speak with Ms. Adams during the week since this was not the appropriate forum.

Mr. Usami indicated that the superintendent's pay is unknown at this time. He mentioned that he was not aware of the new FEMA program. He indicated in the past it was 75% reimbursement until funds ran out. He indicated that the district has been reimbursed fully for PPE and disinfectant through other grants.

Mr. Blundo asked Mr. Usami to explain what happens with funds if the interim superintendent's salary is lower or the district receives unanticipated funds after the budget is approved.

Mr. Usami explained that it becomes excess surplus which may be deposited into reserve accounts such as capital reserve which funds construction projects and for future budgets to offset taxes. He mentioned the \$2.2 million of excess surplus which is supporting the 2021-2022 budget.

Ms. Adams asked about categories within the budget. She added that she would like them on the website.

Dr. Gundersen indicated that the budget presentation is linked in the agenda on the website.

Ms. Molinelli said that the budget is always available to the public.

Mr. Usami indicated that the budget is advertised in the paper with the categories that Ms. Adams may be seeking.

Mr. Weaver commented that a lot of time and effort is taken to build the budget and the next one will most likely start after this one is finalized. He appreciated the time and effort.

Ms. Molinelli added the Finance, Facilities, Health and Education Committees have priorities and provide input for the budget throughout the year. The budget process is overseen by the Finance Committee. The Board is involved throughout the year.

Mr. Blundo who is on the Facilities Committee indicated that maintaining and improving the buildings and athletic fields have been done without bonding. He credited Mr. Usami and his predecessors.

Mr. Fronte who is an engineering consultant commented that the HVAC/Filtration project is a response to address COVID.

Pam Baxley of Wyckoff and former district business administrator praised Dr. Gundersen's work for his forward thinking and pursuit of excellence. She mentioned his ability to assemble a stellar team in curriculum development, technology and special services resulted in the most prepared district in the state when the pandemic hit.

Dr. Blundy indicated that in the past her offices participated in Teacher Appreciation Week by offering free massages.

Dr. Gundersen thanked Jorge Ospino for his 28 dedicated years of service. He recalled when he first started and worked after hours, Mr. Ospino would make him feel welcomed and safe. He mentioned that the custodial staff represents the building when other staff are not present. They assist students access their lockers and assist teachers carry equipment to and from the building.

Dr. Gundersen commented on his retirement. He recalled his mentors when he started in the district as a physics teacher and he mentioned his mentors when he was getting into administration. He thanked the Board and prior Boards for having the faith in him to lead the district. He hoped he made connections with the staff, community and students. He thanked Ms. Baxley and Mr. deMarrais for their kind words. He said the district is truly a special place. He mentioned the great times that were celebrated and the difficult times, but he always felt supported, welcomed and appreciated. He thanked his team, colleagues, staff, Pat, Dyane and Claudia for the support given to him.

Mr. Usami commented that Dr. Gundersen was born to be a superintendent. He acted like a veteran superintendent even in his first year. He mentioned that one of the main reasons why he returned was because of Dr. Gundersen. He thanked him for all things he accomplished and the support he received in his growth as a business administrator.

Mr. Blundo commented that Dr. Gundersen hired the best people and it shows. He said that the best attracts the best. He thanked Dr. Gundersen for what he has done for the district. He appreciated Dr. Gundersen's sense of loyalty and commitment to the district despite that he is leaving to another district.

Mr. Fronte said that in business he can buy talent, but he cannot buy character and enthusiasm. He thanked Dr. Gundersen.

#### XVII. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Citizens are invited to make comments and are limited to five minutes, according to the Pascack Valley Regional High School District Board of Education policy number 0167. Persons wishing to speak must, upon being recognized, rise and state their name and address.

Carolee Adams of Montvale asked if detailed cost from this year's budget for the mascot change will be in writing and shared with the public.

Mr. Blundo indicated that the Finance Committee will be recommending three options that range approximately between \$100,000 to \$300,000 with details including cost. The amount has not changed and this will be discussed with the Board at the next meeting.

Mr. Fronte as chair of the committee confirmed that the Finance Committee has the details and will present it to the Board.

Mr. Blundo indicated that the committee will decide how the information will be shared. He did not want to commit that it will be shared before the meeting.

Christine Pollinger of Oradell and assistant principal of Pascack Valley High School thanked Dr. Gundersen for his contributions to the district. She thanked him for welcoming her to the district and genuinely supporting her by encouraging her and challenging her.

Eli Moallem of River Vale was not sure why maintenance funds could be used to replace the end zone at Hills. He also asked that if there are savings for any reason throughout the year if it gets back to the benefit of the taxpayers or does it become the discretion of the Board on how to spend it.

Mr. Usami indicated that the maintenance reserve funds may be used for the end zone which was confirmed by the auditor. He mentioned that savings go into reserve accounts like capital and maintenance and into excess to be used in a future budget. Those are the ways to utilize savings.

Mr. Moallem asked about the logos and wanted assurances that there will be no issues like the mascot.

Mr. Zeller said there was an initial meeting with the consultant and the committee (students, teachers and administrators) and discussed all the things involved with a logo. A survey was sent today to the entire student body on every single aspect that goes into a logo. The information will be codified by the committee and sent to the designer who will send back several different images. The committee will review and send comments and then it will be sent to the student body for a vote.

Mr. Blundo asked if the consultant is aware of our concerns.

Mr. Zeller said the consultant is aware and the student survey asks what they are looking for in the logo.

Mr. Moallem asked if parents or taxpayers will be on the committee and how long the process will take.

Ms. Molinelli indicated that board members are part of the committee.

Dr. Gundersen said they are hoping to have images selected and approved by the end of the school year.

Ms. Adams asked if the student survey could be shared.

Ms. Molinelli responded to contact Dr. Gundersen.
