X. OLD BUSINESS

Board Committee Reports – Buildings and Grounds

Mr. Hallowell gave an overview of the Buildings and Grounds meeting. He commented on staff changes, including the addition of a new building coordinator at Pascack Hills. Mr. Hallowell informed the board of the status of the twelve (12) projects that were taken up over the summer. Nine (9) have been completed and three (3) are still outstanding. The music renovation is targeted for completion in January of 2020. The transformer project at Pascack Valley is under utility review.

The security upgrade for the door hardware project has been completed. The other pending security projects are ongoing. The next phase will be the addition of strobes, cameras and integration. That should be completed by the end of next summer.

Mr. Scher asked about the paving of the Pascack Hills parking lot. Dr. Gundersen explained that it had been scheduled and was completed according to our original plan. Mr. Scher also asked what the next step was regarding the boosters and clubs. Dr. Gundersen explained that reviewing, improving procedures in that area is one of the board goals for this year, and it is an ongoing project.

XI. NEW BUSINESS

Dr. Gundersen welcomed the student representatives and commented that Back to School night is coming up.

XII. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Citizens are invited to make comments and are limited to five minutes, according to the Pascack Valley Regional High School District Board of Education policy number 0167. Persons wishing to speak must, upon being recognized, rise and state their name and address.

Ms. Traub of Woodcliff Lake commented that the security hardware improvement was welcomed. She asked when Alyssa's law is mandated for implementation. Dr. Gundersen replied that he was uncertain of the exact date that the implementation was mandated but assured her that we would be finished with implementation prior to that date as we have been working toward that goal. The company has not yet been selected to complete the project.

Dr. Gundersen told Ms. Traub he would be happy to provide her with more information regarding the requirements of the new law. She asked if the board had decided on whether to allow an anonymous TIPS line to be instituted. She commented that the front door at Pascack Hills is not always locked. Dr. Gundersen explained that the armed security officer has the ability to keep it locked or open. He would look into the issue further.

Ms. Gloeggler of Montvale asked for an update on transportation. Dr. Gundersen replied that the issues that the district had last week had been resolved for our district.

XIII. ADJOURNMENT

A motion was made by Mr. Scher to adjourn at 8:52 p.m. Mr. Blundo seconded the motion, which was unanimously carried
