Monthly Reports

Superintendent's Report: Mr. P. Erik Gundersen

Congratulations to our scouts and athletes who are being recognized this evening for their outstanding accomplishments! Your accomplishments are reflective of the dedication and hard work you have exhibited over many years. We appreciate you representing our district in such a positive way and thank you for a job well done!

Feedback surveys have been issued to students, staff and most recently parents. The district will be using this feedback to guide us in making potential modifications to our Pascack schedule, assessment methods, and communication systems. I look forward to sharing this information with the Board and the community in the coming weeks.

This past month our regional school districts joined together to present our 2nd annual speaker series featuring New York Times bestselling author and acclaimed speaker, Jessica Lahey. Ms. Lahey summarized current research on teaching, competence, praise, failure and offered parents practical advice for fostering self-motivation. As a follow-up, Mr. Weiland and Ms. Rossi will be conducting a book study of Ms. Lahey's book, "The Gift of Failure." The book study will take place tomorrow at 7:30pm at PVIIS.

The Hills/Valley Coalition will be hosting our district's next featured speaker, Dr. Kevin Sabet. Dr. Sabet, Director of the Drug Policy Institute at the University of Florida, writes and speaks of "Reefer Madness" where he speaks of the scientific truths and dangers of marijuana use – particularly for today's adolescent. He will be speaking at PVHS at 7pm on May 3rd.

Our mission is to prepare our students for what they can expect when they enter college and embark on their career. One element of this is to challenge more of our students to the rigors of college level coursework. Today both the boys' and girls' basketball team play in the first round of the state tournament. The boys' basketball team had a particularly successful season with a 22-3 record, the number one seed in the state tournament, and the Big North Patriot Division title. The wrestling team finished with a respectable 15-11 record with Joe Keller taking second

place at 120lbs & John Giardina taking third place at 113lbs in the district wrestling tournament.

The Pascack girls swimming team won the conference championship for the 6th year in a row!

Senior Jeanna Pic represented Hills at the National Girls and Women in Sports recognition program held at Seton Hall University in late January. Winter sports are coming to a close and the spring sports are beginning this Friday.

Last week was the DECA State Competition in Atlantic City New Jersey. We have 3 individuals and two teams moving onto nationals in Anaheim California in April. Also at DECA, Ms. Corin Gamgort was honored at the opening ceremonies with the "Outstanding New DECA Advisor" Award. Ms. "G" has worked extremely hard to quickly put the Hills DECA program on the map and is recognized around the state as a very competitive team.

In preparation for the fast approaching prom season, students involved in Becca's Closet are collecting prom dresses to be distributed to underprivileged high schools.

Hills sophomore journalist, Mia Espino's article, "Proud Daughter of a Police Officer" was published in the Jan/Feb Issue of NJ Blue Now.

Congratulations to the staff of The Trailblazer. The Hills school newspaper was recently recognized by the Columbia Scholastic Press Association with a Gold Medalist Certification.

On February 15th, 17 talented Hills musicians were inducted into the Tri-M Music Honor Society. The induction ceremony included beautiful performances from each of the inductees.

Congratulations to freshman Miranda Luo on being selected for All North Jersey Junior Band.

And finally, The Hills Spring Musical "Big Fish" opens this Thursday night and promises to be a great show. There will be individual shows Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights, with the final show at 2pm on Sunday afternoon.

Kelly Petro – Pascack Valley High School

On Wednesday, February 15, The Environmental Club invited a guest speaker Aviva Chill from Ethical Choices Program to come discuss healthy eating and the ethics of American agriculture. She presented ways students can modify their diet to reduce risks of heart disease, diabetes, and cancer.

The PV World Culture Club members have become even more global throughout their understanding and appreciation of how different cultures celebrate various holidays- known and unknown alike. Arts and crafts, food, music, dance, legends and storytelling are just a few of the keys utilized to achieve our goal.

Pascack swimming had another successful season. The boys' team made it to the state sectional tournament as the eighth seed and lost a hard fight meet against the fifth seed Union City ending their season with a record of 4-6. Additionally, they were third at the league championship. The girls' team made it to the state sectional quarterfinals as the fifth seed. They were victorious against the fourth seed Montclair winning 87-83 and fell to the number one seed, Morristown, ending their season with a record of 9-3. They were fourth in the county meet of champions and took home first in their league for the seventh consecutive season.

The Spanish NHS hosted a bake sale this afternoon. All proceeds will be used to purchase a blanket and toys for a boy in Westwood battling cancer.

The Class of 2020 had a movie night on February 15 showing *The Notebook*, which features an elderly man retelling the story of falling in love to his wife who is suffering from Alzheimer's disease. Half the proceeds were donated to the Alzheimer's Association. It was a very successful night.

The PV French Honor Society will begin a donation drive in March, to benefit their service project organization, Hope For Haiti (http://hopeforhaiti.com), which benefits this Caribbean country, the poorest in the western hemisphere. Haiti has been affected by natural disasters, such as the 2010 earthquake and last year's Hurricane Matthew; as well as a lack of educational resources, unclean living conditions, and limited access to healthcare.

The PV French students are excited to host 17 students from our partner school in France, Lycée Amiral de Grasse, from April 19 to 30. This will be the third visit from our partner school since 2014. Three chaperones will accompany the high school-age students, who will stay with PV students' families. The French students will spend four days attending class at PVHS with their American counterparts; and, also tour New York City, and surrounding areas, with their teachers on other days. A "Meet & Greet" is tentatively planned for Wednesday, April 26; during the Pascack Period, in the PV Cafeteria, where all administrators, faculty, and students may get to know our guests from France.

PV Choir's Talent Night took place on February 3. Thirty-nine students worked together with 4 adults to put on this event. We were able to raise \$1,110 for next year's choir trip. Thank you for all who made this such a successful night.

Negotiations Committee

Mr. Stankus went to the Pascack Valley PFO meeting. The PFO needs members because membership has been declining. Over the past four years the PFO at Pascack Valley has granted over \$100,000 for scholarships.

Mr. Scher asked about the status of the Wellness Center. Parents have donated funds and want to continue to expand and grow the center. Mr. Gundersen said the guidance advisory committee has been meeting and the supervisor has allocated funds in his upcoming budget for wellness. The board is prepared to support, within reason, recommendations from that committee.

XIV. NEW BUSINESS

XV. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Citizens are invited to make comments and are limited to five minutes, according to the Pascack Valley Regional High School District Board of Education policy number 0167. Persons wishing to speak must, upon being recognized, rise and state their name and address.

Carol Lee Adams from Montvale informed the board that the state of MD has introduced legislation to protect children from the effects of too much screen time. She referred to the articles that she had forwarded to the board for consideration of additions to the health policy to include vision and screen time protections.

She went on to discuss an email she sent to the board regarding the impact of computer usage on exam scores. She provided the link to the full report. She asked if we are considering putting together a health committee to look into this. Mr. Gundersen reported that they have had informal discussions regarding posture and sleep issues with regard to technology usage. Her articles are useful and we are looking into it. With regards to the impact of educational achievement, the studies she referenced were regarding computer usage for note taking. The technology we use is integrated into the curriculum it is not for note taking. The West Point study focused on the distraction when using the tablets for taking notes. We have completely infused technology into the curriculum.

Ms. Adams commented that there have only been two winter events this year. She gets calls from senior citizens looking for students to shovel. "Snow Angels" a program to linkup students and seniors would be a good idea. The students could perform the service as a fundraiser or service project. It doesn't have to be free.

Mr. Derosa from Hillsdale commented that the town has considered a program to help seniors with snow shoveling.
