Superintendent's Report: Mr. P. Erik Gundersen

The Chamber Choir performed for Senior Citizens Day on April 20. We also have 7 students preparing for All State Chorus auditions that will take place on April 29 at Paramus High School. We hope to have good news on their results for the May Board of Education meeting.

The boy's lacrosse teams at Pascack Hills and Pascack Valley teamed up to raise money and bring awareness to suicide prevention. The teams competed in a game scrimmage on Saturday, March 24 having raised close to \$1,100 for suicide prevention.

Congratulations to the Pascack Valley girls' basketball team for a tremendous season. The team has received additional recognition since the March Board of Education meeting. The team was selected Team of the Year for North Jersey. They were ranked #10 in the State and #18 in the Tri State area. In addition, Brianna Wong was recognized as the Big North Player of the Year and named First Team All-State Group 3. Brianna Smith was named Second Team All-State Group. Congratulations to all of the individual and team awards.

This past Friday, April 14, students from the 2015-2016 Physics and Technology class had their scale model bridge designs placed on display at The Tappan Zee Bridge Outreach Centers in both Nyack and Tarrytown, New York. The models will be prominently displayed in the front window of each location for two months. Currently, there are three scale models at the Nyack Outreach Center and two scale models at the Tarrytown Outreach Center. At the conclusion of the two-month time period, we will replace the models with new designs from the students in our current class - the 2016-2017 Physics & Technology students. For each of the past two school years, students have studied the physics related to a bridge. We invited guest speakers from the Educational Outreach Department including Mr. Daniel Marcy and Mr. Andrew O'Rourke into

our class for each of the past two years. Our students have been able to ask questions related to schooling necessary to work on a project of this magnitude, career opportunities, costs, materials used, testing of materials by third parties, accounting systems, transportation of materials both on roads and on the river, staffing needs, the I Lift NY crane, scheduling, and how the construction officials will meet the due date. The models that our students make are designed and made with the use of our Stratasys 3D printer, our Epilog laser cutter, and hand assembled parts. These bridges represent what each group of students believe should be the style of the NEW Tappan Zee Bridge as if the design review process has not yet been finalized. Students get to choose their style of bridge - whether it be a suspension, cable-stayed, cantilever, beam or arch style bridge. Students are required to research the styles, come up with a proven and sound rationale for their choice and present a persuasive oral presentation to school building administrators, parents, teachers and the representatives from the Tappan Zee Outreach Center.

On April 19, the PV French class welcomed 16 students from our French partner school, Lycée Amiral de Grasse, in southern France. The students will accompany their American partners to school each day; to either attend classes at PV or visit New York City with their teachers. A potluck dinner was held on April 22, for all students and families involved in this exchange program. On April 26, a "meet & greet" is scheduled in the cafeteria during Pascack Period to which all administrators, faculty, and students are invited. The PV and French students have been communicating through Edmodo.com and on various social media for several months. They are thrilled to finally "meet" one another. This collaboration between the two high schools began with Skype sessions in 2012. In fact, Admiral de Grasse, for which our partner school is named, was a French participant of the American Revolution. The PV French class would like to thank everyone involved in this exchange program, especially the host families, for their dedication and participation. The Smoke Signal is busy as ever as it begins to wrap up this school year and plan for the next one. Staffers are hard at work on a year-end print issue with more sophisticated design concepts and visuals than they have ever attempted. Adviser Bill Rawson and editors Lauren Cohen and Sarah Schmoyer visited a national journalism convention from April 6 to 9 in Seattle, where they attended two full days of workshop sessions and even found a few spare moments to check out the city. Lauren Cohen earned an Honorable Mention award in a feature story contest at the convention. She and roughly 100 other student journalists gathered in a room and took notes on a presentation and Q & A, and they then had an hour to craft a feature story about the person, certainly no easy task. And in other Smoke Signal news, the application and interview process for next year's editorial staff is underway, with announcements to be made on that front in the coming weeks.

Suzy Koons, a senior at Pascack Valley HS and French Honor Society member; is a winner of the 2017 AATF (American Association of Teachers of French) Creative Writing Award! She received a certificate, lanyard, medallion, and \$50 from this national organization. Suzy's essay, in French, was chosen from among 84 national entries and is printed in their newsletter, L'Elan (Spring 2017, Vol. 44, No. 2). This year's essay topic was: *If you had a time*

machine, in which era would you go and why? Congratulations to Suzy on this wonderful accomplishment.

XV. OLD BUSINESS

Committee Reports:

Negotiations:

Ms. Bissinger met last week with the negotiations committee and they have a tentative agreement. PVREA is voting this week.

Technology:

Ms. Bissinger reported that a new website will be up by the end of June and that there is now a district twitter account. An audit of canvas was conducted and a few things need to be tweaked including calendar postings by teachers. She also reported that students will be able to keep their laptops over the summer. Mr. Scher commented that the NJ school performance reports came out and the district seems to excel in AP and SAT but falls short in music and art. He would like to know why. Mr. Gundersen stated that Dr. Bachenheimer will be giving an overview of that report in the near future and that as a district we do not offer as many opportunities during the day to take additional electives. Those extra periods automatically give students more art and music classes. This is the main reason we score lower in those areas. This is intuitional history here at Pascack Valley Regional. We have seven classes and lunch not eight. There are benefits and drawbacks to our schedule.

Mr. Steinberg asked if we are classifying these courses correctly? Mr. Gundersen replied that we were.

Mr. Scher stated that we have a transgender policy and a growing transgender population. He wanted to know if we are educating our students in this area? He didn't think we were doing enough because we don't address it in every grade, only freshmen and senior year. We have a curriculum meeting coming up and he will bring it up at that time.
