Monthly Reports

Superintendent's Report: Mr. P. Erik Gundersen

This past month I was honored to be invited to the White House to attend the "Symposium for the Future of Research in Education." I am excited that Pascack Valley has been selected to represent other K-12 educational institutions on how to improve the way research is conducted and the method in which research results are disseminated to educational practitioners. Too often, research results are not shared with educators in the field and the Department of Education, Digital Promise, and institutions of higher learning such as Stanford University are seeking ways to truly use data to improve

educational practice. I will continue to update the Board on the work that is done and how Pascack will be involved in such work.

As mentioned at a previous meeting, the New Jersey Teacher of the Year is our own Ms. Argine Safari! She will be on sabbatical for the second half of the year where she will work closely with the NJ Department of Education to serve as a teacher representative to the Department. She will also travel around the state to speak to various organizations. We couldn't be more proud and excited for Ms. Safari.

Both curriculum night – orientations have taken place – targeting our 8th grade students and their families so they know the academic opportunities that will be here for them when they begin their freshman year. The orientation will continue in January when the focus will be on co-curricular activities.

The Annual College Fair was held at Pascack Valley High School last week. Over 180 colleges and over a thousand students were in attendance for the event. Next year, the event will move to Northern Valley as our two districts share the cost and responsibilities of hosting the event.
