WHEREAS, the Pascack Valley Regional High School District Board of Education ("Board") advertised for bids for the Athletic Field Upgrades Phase 2 Project at Pascack Hills High School ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2017, the Board received bids for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the lowest responsible bid for this Project was submitted by Rochelle Contracting Co., Inc. ("Rochelle Contracting") with a base bid in the amount of \$2,120,000, together with Alternate No. 1, in the amount of \$45,000; Alternate No. 2, in the amount of \$40,000; Alternate No. 3, in the amount of \$42,000; Alternate No. 4, in the amount of \$3,200; Alternate No. 5, in the amount of \$14,400; Alternate No. 6, in the amount of \$3,500; and Alternate No. 7, in the amount of \$114,000, for a total contract sum of \$2,382,100; and

WHEREAS, the bid submitted by Rochelle Contracting is responsive in all material respects and it is the Board's desire to award the contract for the Project to Rochelle Contracting.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- a. The Board hereby awards the contract for the Project to Rochelle Contracting for total contract sum of \$2,382,100.
- b. This award is expressly conditioned upon the contractor furnishing the requisite insurance certificate and labor and materials/performance bond as required in the project specifications, together with an AA201-Project Manning Report, and an executed A-101, Standard Form of Agreement Between Owner and Contractor, and an A-201, General Conditions of the Contract for Construction, as prepared by the Board Attorney, within ten (10) days of the date hereof.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board Attorney is hereby directed to draft the agreement with the successful bidder consistent with this Resolution and with the terms contained in the bid documents approved by the Board for the Project. The Board President and the Board Secretary are hereby authorized to execute such agreement and any other documents necessary to effectuate the terms of this Resolution.

Mr. Steinfeld read number 12 into the record (donations).

Mr. Scher asked about the format of the statements for student government bank accounts.

Mr. Hallowell inquired about the Certificate of Insurance for the contractors who were awarded the athletic project. Mr. Scher had questions about the 18-21 year program and if the facility could handle expansion if necessary and what would be necessary for the retrofit. Ms. Molinelli asked how long the district was required to keep hard copies of files. Mr. Scher questioned if we were salvaging as much as we could from the building before demolition. Ms. Baxley and Mr. Gundersen discussed and addressed all of those issues with the board.

#### XI. OLD BUSINESS

Committee Report: Negotiations Committee

Ms. Bissinger reported that the committee met and scheduled the next meeting for the end of this month.

Ms. Molinelli said the show 'Big Fish" was amazing and sent a terrific message.

Mr. Steinfeld commented that Mr. Fournier has done an amazing job elevating the program. He was a star here when he was a student.

Mr. Stankus wanted to congratulate the girls' basketball team. Kelly Petro was complimented.

Mr. Steinfeld asked her to explain the tournament of champions. The group three state championship was the real championship and they already are the state champions. The tournament does count towards wins however.

Mr. Blundo described a social media conversation about honoring Coach Jasper. He is only 10 wins away from 1000 wins.

#### XII. NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Gundersen recognized the research in the molecular genetic course where four students are advancing in the science competition.

Mr. Steinberg commented on a financial conference that he attended, where the demand for engineers is high. Financial companies are looking for students who can code. Mr. Gundersen explained that one of the benefits of belonging to the League of Innovative Schools is that we can go to the Ed Tech conference. This is a benefit as it gives him a better sense of how to prepare students for these areas. Also the MIT trip reaffirmed that our students are being exposed to coding and computational thinking. We are working with the math supervisor to infuse coding into the curriculum so all students get that exposure. This again emphasizes the importance of preparing students for STEM. We can work with the K8s to develop maker spaces. Also the fabricating center at Pascack Hills should be expanded and improved.

When he asked what freshman are lacking when they arrive at MIT, he was told that they lacked the ability to collaborate and problem solve. Communication skills need work. Lastly, MIT looked at the freshman year experience as "grade/ no grade". There is no record of a failing grade as they allow for the adjustment if the student repeats the course.

Ms. Molinelli asked about the delineation between girls and boys. For the most part the split is equal according to Mr. Gundersen. Molecular genetics is a good split. Robotics teams as well are split equally. We are above the national average. We need to improve on the coding aspect.

Ms. Bissinger gave a recap of the Robotics team experience.

program and how the facility would be used. He also congratulated Kelly Petro and the girls' team.

Mr. Gundersen reminded the audience that school would be closed the next day as a result of the impending snow storm and he would update the public regarding Wednesday when more news was available.
