### IV. ROUTINE MATTERS

Monthly Reports

Superintendent's Report: Mr. P. Erik Gundersen

Today our students are reminding adults about what it means to take civil action in the expressed desire that such action will result in positive change. I am speaking of our student leaders at both Pascack Valley and Pascack Hills High Schools who – on their own – planned and implemented two different – but respectful and thoughtful student walkouts in the wake of the Parkland shooting incident in Florida. A number of our students were also represented in related marches this weekend.

Our district is not endorsing any particular political viewpoint on the matter, but what we have and will continue to support is our students' collective desire to analyze facts, develop opinions, listen respectfully to others, and ultimately refine and communicate those viewpoints in a way that is impactful, intelligent, and thoughtful. Our students made us proud.

I have had the opportunity to meet with the mayor and councils for Montvale and Woodcliff Lake to give my annual report on what is taking place in the Pascack Valley Regional High School District. I am pleased that the municipal governing bodies continue to express strong support for the work that we are doing as a district and share our sentiments regarding how proud we are of the growth our students are demonstrating.

Tonight we continue to recognize how our students are consistently exceeding our expectations in the arts, community activism, volunteerism, and athletics. We thank you

for being here this evening and for representing the Pascack Valley Regional High School District in such a positive manner.

Student Reports:

Olivia Lein – Pascack Hills High School

On February 27th the Pascack Hills DECA team competed in the State DECA competition in Atlantic City. An impressive 60 students competed for the opportunity to earn spots for the National competition. When it was over, 12 Hills students qualified and will move on to Nationals in Atlanta in late April.

At the NJ Regional Science Fair on March 9th, an amazing 9 Hills students were awarded 1st place in their respective categories. All in all, 24 Hills students won awards. 3 students Natalia Murillo, Rebecca Volkov, and Jade Greenberg qualified for the International Science and Engineering Fair in Pittsburgh in May. Congratulations to these students along with Dr. Edelberg and Ms. Macke on this impressive showing.

The Hills theater program may have yet again put on the best show in the history of the program. RENT took the stage by storm earlier this month in front of large audiences in each of the four shows. Actors, stage crew and musicians all worked feverishly to put on an amazing production.

Recently Hills students took time to pen handwritten cards and letters to students at Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida. The cards and letters were mailed down in an effort to show support to the students directly impacted by the February 14th tragedy. On March 14th, a large majority of Hills students participated in a National walk out to pay tribute to the victims and voice concerns about congress inaction.

The Hills Music department recently hosted 2 inter-district concerts, one for band and one for chorus. Students from Fieldstone and Woodcliff Lake Middle School took the stage with Hills students and performed magnificently. Also, on March 22nd, the Hills orchestra took a bronze medal at the West Essex music festival.

On March 16th, the Hills Junior class hosted the Junior Prom at the Park Ridge Marriott. More than 250 students attended. From all accounts, a great time was had by all.

In sports, the spring season is off to a slow start thanks to the weather. However, as we speak, the girl's lacrosse team, softball team, and baseball team are taking advantage of great weather in much warmer climates as they prepare for the opening of the season on April 1st.

That officially concludes my March report.

# Amelia Moran - Pascack Valley High School

Pascack Swimming had another extremely successful season. The boys ended their season against Livingston in the first round of the State Sectional Tournament with a season record of 5-6. The girls were victorious against Livingston in the first round, but fell to Montclair in the second round of States. They ended their season with a record of 9-2 and won their 8th straight Big North League Championship title. During their final meet against Montclair, the 200 Free Relay team of Emma Wentland, Jen Malocha, Danni Freeman, and Haleigh Marzano lowered their school record for the 3rd time this season. They competed in the Individual State Meet of Champions coming in 35th in the entire state. Haleigh Marzano also competed in the 200 Individual Medley earning 21st place and the 100 Breaststroke earning 17th place in the entire state of New Jersey.

On Thursday, March 15, five students from Pascack Valley flew to Madrid to participate in the third year of the district's Spanish Exchange Program. During their time in Spain, students stayed with families and attended classes at IES Infante Don Fadrique. They were also able to visit the cities of Madrid, Toledo, Córdoba, and Seville. In May, twelve students and two teachers from IES Infante Don Fadrique will visit Pascack Valley.

The Interact Club held two bake sales to raise funds for Pony Power during the month of February, and we just recently began planting flowers for the new garden at PV.

Pascack Valley recently earned a \$2,000 grant for a school garden through Whole Kids Foundation. The grant was prepared by Julianne Downes, Kristen Lindstrom, Michela Piccoline, Aarti Mallya, and Noemi Rodriguez. The goal is to create an interactive and edible garden with cross-disciplinary applications. The Family and Consumer Science Department, Early Childhood and Education Preschool classes, the Environmental Club, and various science classes will work closely through this interdisciplinary opportunity focusing on farm-to-table cooking, organic foods, composting, proper nutrition, and microbiology, symbiosis, photosynthesis, and ecology concepts.

In Mr. Sherman's Video Production classes, students spent the last two weeks competing in the New Jersey 10 Day Film Challenge. On Day 1, teachers from over 50 schools received the new prompt, which includes a character, line of dialogue, prop, and backstory. Students then have 10 school days to write, shoot, and edit a three to four minute film. On March 27, Mr. Sherman's two Advanced Video Production Classes will be visiting ABC studios in New York. They will be touring the news studio and the *Live with Kelly and Ryan* set. You can catch an entire recap of this trip, in addition to other events going on at PV, this Thursday on an all new PVTV News.

Congratulations to this year's wrestling team on one of the most successful seasons in PV's history. The team had a 22-5 overall record, including the 600th win in program history. The team was BCCA Group B Champs, Big North League Champs, and for the first time North 1 Group 3 State Sectional Champs. Seniors Robbie Natelli and Casey Lewis each recorded their 100th career victories. Tommy Chiellini was a

Regional Champion and Matt Beyer was named All-County. Coach Tom Gallione was also recognized as the Bergen County Coaches Association Coach of the Year and the Big North Coach of the Year by both fellow coaches and NJ.com. NJ.com also ranked the team as the #3 Group 3 team in the state. Congratulations on a remarkable season.

Congratulations to the PV Girls Basketball team for a remarkable season. The team was Big North League Champs for the 35<sup>th</sup> time and played in the Bergen County Finals. The graduating seniors leave PV with an 80-12 record, a truly amazing accomplishment. Coach Jasper earned his 1000 win as a coach. Kelly Petro, Brianna Wong, and Brianna Smith earned All County First Team honors. Kelly Smith was named to the Second Team All-County team. All four athletes also earned First Team Big North All League honors. Toriana Tabasco was named Second Team Big North All League. Kelly Petro and Brianna Wong were selected for the North/South All Star Game and for the McDonald's All American Game. Lastly, Brianna Smith had 115 three pointers and became a 1000 point scorer with 1023 points. Brianna Wong also became a 1000 point scorer with 1159 points. Congratulations to the entire team on a wonderful season.

### 15. Alliance For Competitive Energy Services ("Aces") - Electric

WHEREAS, the Alliance For Competitive Energy Services (hereinafter referred to as "ACES"), an alliance composed of the New Jersey School Boards Association (hereinafter referred to as "NJSBA"), the New Jersey Association of School Administrators, and the New Jersey Association of School Business Officials, will from time to time during the Effective Period as defined below solicit bids from electric power suppliers for electric generation services through an energy aggregation program in which NJSBA will act as Lead Agency of the ACES

Cooperative Pricing System #E8801-ACESCPS in accordance with the "Public School Contracts Law", N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1 et seq., and the Electric Discount and Energy Competition Act, N.J.S.A. 48:3-49 et seq. ("EDECA") and the regulations promulgated thereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Pascack Valley Regional High School District is a Participating member of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System and is eligible thereby to obtain electric generation services for its own use through one or more contracts to be awarded to electric power suppliers following said bids for electric generation services pursuant to the aggregation program; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will from time to time during the Effective Period (from date of adoption through May, 2023 hereinafter referred to as "Effective Period") issue one or more Requests for Bids for electric generation services on behalf of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System pursuant to the Public School Contracts Law and EDECA; and

WHEREAS, due to significant volatility and the potential for price increases in the wholesale electric market, Participating Members will preauthorize the Lead Agency to award contracts for Electric Generation Service in each service territory to one or more electric power suppliers that submit bids which are reasonably forecasted to provide estimated savings to the Participating Member based upon its previous electric usage and utility provided Basic Generation Service rates; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will only award contracts for said electric generation services to electric power suppliers that submit bids with pricing reasonably estimated to be lower than the utility-provided basic generation service; and

WHEREAS, the District agrees to purchase all electric power needed for its own use (exclusive of on-site electric generation sources) during the Effective Period through any electric power supplier(s) awarded a contract, it being understood that the term of any one contract shall be subject to the provisions of Public School Contracts Law;

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will notify the Department of Community Affairs' Division of Local Government Services by mail prior to the issuance a Request for Bids for electric generation services, with the understanding that if the Division of Local Government Services does not respond within 10 business days, it will be deemed to have approved the issuance of the Request for Bids or the Request for Rebids.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

**RESOLVED** that the District binds itself to the ACES Cooperative Pricing System ##E8801-ACESCPS to purchase all electric power needed for its own use (exclusive of on-site electric generation sources) during the Effective Period from the electric power supplier or suppliers awarded a contract for electric generation services by the Lead Agency; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Lead Agency of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System is hereby authorized to execute a master performance agreement that obligates the district to purchase electricity at the terms and conditions stated therein with a third-party supplier or suppliers who have been awarded the contract or contracts by the Lead Agency on behalf of the participating members of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System #E8801-ACESCPS (or any CPS number to be assigned in the future), and provided further that all such contracts shall be at prices reasonably forecast and estimated by the Lead Agency to provide savings to the Districts relative to the price charged for basic generation service by the electric public utility that would otherwise provide such service; and, be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED** that ACES is authorized to continue to bid to obtain electric generation services at any time during the Effective Period on behalf of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System including, for example, a rebid if energy market conditions do not initially lead to a successful bid, on additional dates to be determined by the Lead Agency; and

**FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage. The authorization provided to the NJSBA pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Laws (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-11(5)), and the Local Public and Public School Contracts Laws Administrative Code (N.J.A.C. 5:34-7.1 et seq.) shall be valid until May, 2023 (the Effective Period) at which time the Cooperative Pricing System will be subject to renewal. Any rescission or expiration of this resolution shall not affect any Agreements entered into prior to such rescission or expiration.

# 16. Alliance For Competitive Energy Services ("Aces") Bid - Gas

WHEREAS, the Pascack Valley Regional High School District is a Participating member of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System and is eligible thereby to obtain natural gas services for its own use through one or more contracts to be awarded to natural gas suppliers following said bids for natural gas services pursuant to the aggregation program; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will from time to time during the Effective Period (from date of adoption through May, 2023, hereinafter referred to as "Effective Period") issue one or more Requests for Bids for natural gas services on behalf of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System pursuant to the Public School Contracts Law and EDECA; and

WHEREAS, due to significant volatility and the potential for price increases in the wholesale natural gas market, Participating Members will preauthorize the Lead Agency to award contracts for Natural Gas Supply Service in each service territory to one or more natural gas suppliers that submits bids which are reasonably forecasted to provide estimated savings to the Participating Member based upon its previous natural gas usage and utility provided Basic Gas Supply Service rates; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will only award contracts for said Natural Gas Supply Services to natural gas suppliers that submit bids with pricing reasonably estimated to be lower than the utility-provided basic gas supply service; and

WHEREAS, the District agrees to purchase all Natural Gas Supply Services for its own use during the Effective Period through any natural gas supplier(s) awarded a contract, it being understood that the term of any one contract shall be subject to the provisions of Public School Contracts Law; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will notify the Department of Community Affairs' Division of Local Government Services by mail prior to the issuance a Request for Bids for natural gas supply services, with the understanding that if the Division of Local Government Services does not respond within 10 business days, it will be deemed to have approved the issuance of the Request for Bids or the Request for Rebids.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

**RESOLVED** that the District binds itself to the ACES Cooperative Pricing System ##E8801-ACESCPS to purchase all natural gas supply services needed for its own use during the Effective Period from the natural gas supplier or suppliers awarded a contract for natural Gas supply services by the Lead Agency; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Lead Agency of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System is hereby authorized to execute a master performance agreement that obligates the district to purchase natural gas at the terms and conditions stated therein with a third-party supplier or suppliers who have been awarded the contract or contracts by the Lead Agency on behalf of the participating members of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System #E8801-ACESCPS (or any CPS number to be assigned in the future), and provided further that all such contracts shall be at prices reasonably forecast and estimated by the Lead Agency to provide savings to the districts relative to the price charged for basic gas supply service by the natural gas public utility that would otherwise provide such service; and, be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED** that ACES is authorized to continue to bid to obtain natural gas services at any time during the Effective Period on behalf of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System including, for example, a rebid if energy market conditions do not initially lead to a successful bid, on additional dates to be determined by the Lead Agency; and

**FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage. The authorization provided to the NJSBA pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Laws (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-11(5)), and the Local Public and Public School Contracts Laws Administrative Code (N.J.A.C. 5:34-7.1 et seq.) shall be valid until May, 2023 (the Effective Period) at which time the Cooperative Pricing System will be subject to renewal.
