Students from Pascack Valley are participating in a pilot program wherein they provide 25 hours of community service per week for four weeks in lieu of attending classes. We have ten students participating at the following locations:

Students are composing weekly reflective journal entries, documenting their service hours and work, and creating 2-minute video presentations on their experience. The pilot is going incredibly well and we look forward to expanding the program in years to come.

From May 18 to 27, six PV students and their chaperone, French teacher Ms. DelGiudice, participated in an exchange program in southern France. This was the second trip to France for the exchange program. The PV students attended classes at the French high school each day with their French classmates, with whose families they stayed. Students visited the Picasso Museum in Antibes, as well as several locations in the French Riviera, including Nice, Cannes, and Monaco. We would like to thank the PVRHSD Administration and Board of Education for their continued support of this enriching experience for our students. Our partner school in France, Lycée Amiral de Grasse, sends their regards and gratitude for this exchange program.

The Hills and Valley NHS, along with Hills Interact Club, ran our Rise Against Hunger food packaging event on May 30. We packaged over 12,000 meals that will be sent to Uganda so that children have the option of going to school instead of working during the day in order to raise enough money for food.

The PV AP Computer Science with WE service learning class completed their global action last week. They held a lunch game day this past Wednesday and Friday where they raised awareness for the global issues regarding access to education. All games were created and coded by Computer Science students. They raised \$175 for PV alumni Scott Karrel's Unlock Foundation.
