9. Submission of 2016 - 2019 Comprehensive Maintenance Plan

WHEREAS, the Department of Education requires New Jersey School Districts to submit three-year maintenance plans documenting "required" maintenance activities for each of its public school facilities; and

WHEREAS, the required maintenance activities as listed in the attached document for the various school facilities of Pascack Valley Regional High School District are consistent with these requirements; and

WHEREAS, all past and planned activities are reasonable to keep school facilities open and safe for use or in their original condition and to keep their system warranties valid; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Pascack Valley Regional High School District Board of Education hereby authorizes the school business administrator to submit the 2016 – 2019 Comprehensive Maintenance Plan for Pascack Valley Regional High School District in compliance with the Department of Education requirements.

10. Reclassification of Occupational & Physical Therapists from independent Contractor to Employee

WHEREAS, there is a dispute between the parties as to whether certain workers classified by taxpayer as Therapist, Ticket Taker, Game Clock Operator & Security Guard are independent contractors or employees of taxpayer for purposes of federal income tax withholding, Federal Insurance contributions Act (FICA) and Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA) taxes (federal employment tax); and

WHEREAS, the taxpayer is presently treating the Therapist, Ticket Taker, Game Clock Operator & Security Guard as independent contractors; and

WHEREAS, the taxpayer has timely filed Forms 1099 for each of its Therapists, Ticket Takers, Game Clock Operators & Security Guards for all applicable periods from January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 3.02 of Rev. Proc. 85-18, 1985-1 C.B.518, and Rul. 81-224, 1981-2C.B. 197: and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to resolve this dispute for all Therapists, Ticket Takers, Game Clock Operators & Security Guards engaged by the taxpayer after January 1, 2014.

NOW IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND AGREED for federal employment tax purposes that:

- a. The IRS will assess and the taxpayer will pay \$49,286.52 in full discharge of any federal employment tax liability it may owe for the period 01/01/2015-12/31/2015 resulting directly or indirectly from its failure to pay and/or withhold federal income tax, FICA or FUTA taxes on payments to its Therapists, Ticket Takers, Game Clock Operators & Security Guards.
- b. The IRS will not disturb taxpayer's classification of such Therapists, Ticket Takers, Game Clock Operators & Security Guards for federal employment tax purposes for any period from January 1, 2014 through August 31, 2018.

c. Beginning September 1, 2018, and for all periods thereafter, Therapists, Ticket Takers, Game Clock Operators & Security Guards and persons performing equivalent duties regardless of taxpayer's job titles will be treated as employees for all federal employment tax purposes.

Mr. Scher also commented on an article in the Smokestack regarding anxiety. The poll in the article indicates that only 15% of those who took the poll did not have anxiety. Mr. Gundersen said it is wonderful that the student who wrote the article had a stigma free environment in which to comment.
