

7:30 pm CHS Updates — Anika Carter Ward, PAC Co-Chair and Cherise Ayers, Principal

- What is going on at Central High School?
 - Prom! Lots of excitement! Ticket sales and making sure the students who are eligible to buy tickets are the ones who are buying tickets. The event is for Central Students. Guests are allowed.
 - What can parents do to help make sure it's a safe, beautiful time to remember? Please have open and honest conversations with your students! There is a lot of driving. Drinking, vaping, drugs, etc. it can lead to bad outcomes. Have the hard conversations! We want to create special, beautiful memories.
 - Suggestion: have a safe word for your child. If your child calls or texts and says that word, you know it's time you to go help them make a safe exit.

- It's Budget Time: Principal Ayers gave a thorough presentation. Slides are here: https://docs.google.com/presentation/d/1t9pPtnodVZL5xcz5DWPnhVgVco3b8zwg rK0HeCMZdFA/edit#slide=id.g267353e09af 0 226
 - Unfortunately there are a lot of cuts happening, and it's happening statewide. As a school, Central is faring better than other schools in the district.
 - Presentation Purpose
 - Tom Sager Executive Chief of Finance video presentation
 - We are facing a budget shortfall largely because of the lack of pandemic-related funds from the federal government.
 - The state of MN is giving more \$, but also more mandates.
 - Watch the 10 min video for more details.
 - Enrollment: Highest was at 1580. Currently it's at 1539. The decline is due to juniors and seniors shifting to alternative programs (e.g., Gordon Park's program)
 - Projection for next year: 1571
 - Staffing:
 - Administrators: Will hold steady at 5 administrators
 - Teachers: General Ed (not special or ELL). Includes all core and elective.
 - School Year 2024 63 FTE (Supply funds used for +1.3 FTE)
 - School Year 2025 60 (Supply funds used for +1.3 FTE)
 - Student support Staff
 - School Year 2024 24
 - School Year 2025 21.5
 - Supplies: Central receives \$175 per student, plus \$110,000 stipend for extracurriculars (this is a set amount for each SPPS high school). Can be used for supplies, field trips, and other supports
 - Central no longer qualifies for Title One funding. This was cut for School Year 2025. This will be a loss of approximately \$184,000. Individual students and families can still get the benefits, (e.g., ACT vouchers, reduced fees, etc.)
 - Discretionary dollars are used for:
 - Additional staff (e.g. lunch supervision)
 - o Theater: annual musical, play, etc.
 - Music Ensembles (jazz band, orchestra, choir)
 - Supporting student organization
 - School-specific goals
 - AP and IB school registration and educational supports
 - How can you help?
 - Advocate for education at the legislative level.
 - Continue to support our booster organizations: PAC, Music Boosters, Robotics Boosters, Sports Boosters, & Theater Boosters

- Help identify and write grant proposals.
- Help purchase supplies! Science supplies, art supplies, photography paper, woodshop supplies, autoshop, etc. are expensive.

Q and A with Principal Ayers

- Did any other schools lose Title One funding?
 - Principal Ayers did not have the answer for this. She surmised that some might have, but others might have increased their enrollments in students who qualify for free and reduced lunch. Central is at 45% which is lower than some other schools in the district.
- Are class sizes increasing?
 - Yes, this will likely be a consequence of the budget shortfall and the goal to continue providing a wide variety of course offerings.
- What is bringing you hope?
 - PAC, the parents, all the people that volunteer and show up for Central. The students are amazing. So much gratitude for all the contributions that are made! We are Central Strong and we're building this T.O.G.E.T.H.E.R.


