# Introduction

Our 2024 Census once again collects together data from every member school in our Association, and shows, through various charts, how the boarding market looks across Australia. Throughout the document you will also see preceding years, and it is interesting to note the changes which have occurred in our sector over these years.

The first section shows the number of boarding schools in each State. Whilst the numbers for 2011 and 2012 are quite low, this reflects the membership of ABSA at that time. Since 2013, however, we have collected from all schools, and thus the pie charts are an accurate reflection of the boarding school makeup of Australia. We are pleased to be able to include the Residential Colleges in Western Australia in this data from 2017 onwards. Please note that there was an error in 2023 - the total number was actually 200 as we missed one school in Western Australia.

Section 2 shows the number of boarders broken down by State (with the ACT and NSW combined), and also shows the split between male and female boarders, from 2012 onwards. We have also included graphs showing co-ed/male/female boarding school numbers.

Section 3 shows the makeup of Year levels in boarding per State and combined for the whole of Australia from 2014 onwards.

The 4th section shows the number of Indigenous and International boarders from 2012 onwards, and the number of rural boarders from 2016 onwards. We have also developed a combined chart showing the numbers of these specific groups over the years.

Section 5 details the number of boys and girls boarding and the number of weekly and metro boarders - with the total number of boarders in the State listed on the Y Axis.











2024 BOARDING SCHOOLS BY GENDER Australia Wide


