What to expect in Year 6 HASS: Investigating Global Diversity

Christian Worldview

When God created man he said, 'Let <u>us</u> make man in <u>our</u> image.' **Genesis 1:26.** The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are in fellowship and union with each other. Similarly, God created us to be in fellowship and union with those he surrounded us with. Does this mean we will always get along, no. But it does mean we need to learn to behave in a godly manner towards others different to us, or as the Bible puts it, 'live peaceably' with others **Romans 12:18**. Geography helps us to understand the relationships countries have with each other and how God wants us to behave towards each other, even when we don't agree on all things. This unit will help students think critically about God's world and the ways in which we live in it, our relationship to Him and others and the ways in which we use God's created world.

Unit overview

Students explore the diverse environments, peoples and cultures within the Asia region and at a global level (space, place, environment) expand their mental map of the world. Students examine Australia's various connections with other countries and places throughout the world, how these are changing, and the effects of these interconnections.

- How do places, people and cultures differ across the world?
- What are Australia's global connections between people and places?
- How do people's connections to places affect their perception of them?

Christian Focus
