Contact cnichols@fcsdfl.org to receive and complete a TSIC Mentor Application. 4. Complete the In Person and Virtual Mentoring Name & Likeness Consent and Release form. 5. Once accepted, sign the Mentor Agreement which will be sent to you by email. 6. Complete the TSIC Mentor Training: The link will be sent to you by email 7. Download the TSIC App to communicate with your mentee. 8. Begin mentoring sessions with your mentee!

Guest Mentors are invited to speak to the students about inspirational, positive, uplifting, or informative topics. Guest mentors come only on one scheduled day.
