Boundary Adjustment Advisory Committee Charter

Purpose

To assist in developing a set of boundary changes required to implement the school consolidations and closures proposed in the resolution entitled "Board Resolution Related to the Facility Master Planning Task Force Recommendations pertaining to community impact of repurposing schools to 4K-8 facilities and proposed school boundary changes" approved on June 5, 2023 and any Green Bay Area Public School District Board of Education directed updates to that Resolution. Boundaries should be developed to ensure equity and the continued diversity of school populations. The committee shall present those recommended boundary changes to the Board of Education by June 10, 2024.

Membership

- The committee will be comprised of 12-16 members who, collectively, roughly mirror both the demography and the geography of the district and reside within the Green Bay Area Public School District. At least two members of the committee shall be GBAPSD students.
- 2. All prospective members must complete an online application via the GBAPS website or a paper copy of that application.
 - a. Those applications, made available in several languages, will be the sole source of consideration in choosing the committee.
 - b. Board members are welcome to encourage people to apply
- 3. The application will provide an opportunity to demonstrate the knowledge, skills and abilities and other characteristics most likely to contribute positively to the work of the committee. For this committee, we will seek applicants who demonstrate:
 - a. Knowledge of and/or experience with the school district or a portion of the school district in any capacity
 - b. Experience on a decision-making or advisory committee
 - c. Experience working with a diverse population
 - d. Commitment to finding *solutions* through discussion and debate.
- 4. The selection team will strive to assemble a committee that represents:
 - a. The ethnic makeup of the school district
 - b. All geographic parts of the district
- 5. Per board policy #185, the selection team will include the President of the Board and the Superintendent. Together they will arrive at:
 - a. A list of 12-16 proposed members
 - b. A list of about 6 alternatives, should they be necessary
- 6. The Board of Education will review and approve the list.

Member Application

The application will consist of the following questions / information. All requested information must be provided to be considered:

- 1. Name
- 2. **Address** [Allows for wide geographic representation]
- 3. Explain your current or previous connection with GBAPS
- 4. What is **your primary reason** for wanting to serve on this advisory committee?
- 5. If you have previously served on any **advisory or deliberative bodies,** including (but not limited to) elected office, please list them (Note: such previous experience is not required)
- 6. Please explain your experience with a diverse population of any kind.
- 7. Do you represent an organization with a vested interest in the outcome of this process? If so, please list the organization(s).
- 8. If we have questions about your application, may we contact you? If so
 - a. Email address
 - b. Phone number

Authority

The committee has no expressed or implied power or authority. Pursuant to Board of Education Policy 170, the advisory committee is to investigate and report on the specific issue of school attendance boundaries. The committee's duties are described below. When the committee completes its work, the committee is automatically disbanded at the time the final report is accepted by the School Board or the committee's work is completed.

Responsibilities

- Respond to information and recommendations providing local perspectives that honors our goals of equity and diversity during the creation of the new school boundaries and feeder patterns required to implement the proposed school consolidations. Some examples of local perspectives are walkability, neighborhood integrity, traffic volume / patterns, etc....
- Provide structured feedback on boundary options proposed by Cooperative Strategies during the iterative development process concerning the potential impact of the boundaries to the local community
- Provide feedback on community surveys to be given to the community and participate in community engagement events.
- Present the recommendations agreed to by the committee to the Board of Education.
 The presentation should include summarized information to inform the board of the impact of changes across the diverse populations of the school district.

Limitations

Demographic data will be provided by the school district to Cooperative Strategies. It is outside the scope of the advisory committee to provide or reference externally sourced data as inputs to the boundary creation process.

Boundaries are drawn using industry GIS software and based on the address and demographic data provided by the school district. It is outside the scope of this advisory committee to create and propose any maps outside the contracted services provided by Cooperative Strategies.

Committee members will participate in the review and approval of public feedback surveys that will be distributed by the district and/or Cooperative Strategies to determine public sentiment. It is outside the scope of an individual committee member's role to solicit feedback on behalf of the committee outside the planned engagements.
