

Draft Maps A – C Narrative

At the May 16, 2024, Dry Creek Joint Elementary School District Board of Trustees meeting, the Trustees highlighted the three distinct communities of (1) Antelope/Sacramento County, (2) the City of Roseville, and (3) the unincorporated areas of Placer County between Antelope and Roseville. The Board also emphasized using main roads and elementary school attendance boundaries as dividers. Draft maps A-C provide different examples of how to incorporate these different parameters within the District.

Draft A: Elementary School Attendance Areas

Total Deviation: 7.4%

Draft A prioritizes maintaining the elementary school attendance areas. This map maintains Coyote Ridge, Heritage Oak, Quail Glen*, and Olive Grove. Creekview Ranch, Antelope Meadows and Barrett Ranch were split due to population balance. The attendance areas were used as dividing lines when possible.

This map also uses the County line as a divider.

*Quail Glen has slight splits due to the Census lines and attendance lines not fully overlapping with each other.

Draft B: Main Roads & Communities of Interest

Total Deviation: 5.9%

The goal of Draft B was to maintain the three communities of interest as previously described while using main roads whenever possible. It creates two seats in the City of Roseville, a seat that is predominantly in the rural area of Placer County, and two seats in Sacramento County.

All attendance areas are split.

Dividing lines described going from south to north:

Area 1 uses N Loop Blvd, Poker Lane, and the railroad line as dividers.

Area 2 predominantly uses the county line as a divider, but Area 3 dips into Sacramento County to balance the population. Cook Riolo Road and Great Valley Drive are used as dividers.

Area 3 uses Baseline Road when possible, but crosses Baseline Road to pick up population.

Areas 4 and 5 use Woodcreek Oaks Blvd. as their dividing line.

Draft C: Main Roads and Communities of Interest

Total Deviation: 7.9%

Draft C places a larger emphasis on following main roads, and it ensures the county line is used as a boundary.

It creates two seats in Roseville, one seat in the unincorporated parts of Placer County, and two seats in Sacramento County.

Barrett Ranch and most of Coyote Ridge attendance areas were maintained, while all other attendance areas were split.

Dividing lines described going from south to north:

Area 1 uses N Loop Blvd, Don Julio Blvd, Poker Lane, Cook Riolo Road, Pruitt Lane, Lewis Ave, Ridgepoint Dr, and Antelope N Road as dividing lines.

Area 2 uses the county line as the divider.

Area 3 uses Baseline Road and Woodcreek Oaks Blvd as dividing lines, except for when Area 5 crosses over Woodcreek Oaks Blvd to pick up population.

Areas 4 and 5 use Woodcreek Oaks Blvd and Pleasant Grove Blvd as dividers. They also use the neighborhood line between Sun City and Quail Glen as a dividing line.
