School Activities Reports.

Elementary School:

AFSA's Title I program is currently serving 41 students in Reading or Math interventions. Students qualify for intervention services through teacher recommendations based on classwork or struggles noticed, test scores, or parent request. Kate Bald and Kristin Hankwitz are the specialist teachers who provide services for this program. It is also the program that supports Literacy and Numeracy night.

Presentation night happened 11/30, just after the last board meeting. The night was a great success with students showing off their learning by performing in music concerts, hosting a wax museum, and presenting "How to" speeches. We are so proud of our Elementary Eagles!

The Elementary has performed safety drills for Fire emergencies, lockdowns, and holds over the past month. At the beginning of the year, all students had bus and pedestrian safety training, and students in 3-6th grade had bicycle safety as well. Safety is an important part of creating a community at school. By practicing all of these emergency plans, students can feel safe and empowered when they are at school.

In our Staff workday on December 1st, Elementary staff focused on enhanced behavior initiatives. Through inservice training, coaching, and case studies over the past few weeks, staff have been able to add many resources to their classroom management "toolboxes."

On Friday, we are hosting a variety of activities for what we call Healthy Lifestyles Day before winter break. Students in grades 4-6 have choices of 5 activities and will rotate through 3 of them. In grades K-3, students rotate in multi-age groups through 3 activities. Activities have a winter theme, and are intended to provide some fun new learning of potential new hobbies or lifelong learning activities for students before we head out on a two-week break.

After winter break, we look forward to our Winter Carnival! Mark your calendars for January 27th from 9-Noon at the Elementary building! The event will include a Silent Auction and concessions hosted by the parent group, games in each classroom hosted by staff, and our Annual Book Fair!

Parent/teacher conferences are also coming up in January on the 25th and 26th. Winter conferences at the Elementary focus on progress monitoring - data from classroom assignments, testing, and social-emotional skills so far in the year. We look forward to celebrating and brainstorming with parents at these conferences!
