

This resource will be used by both gifted and talented teachers and the counselor to support an effective learning environment. Some gifted students often struggle with managing big emotions. Teachers and the counselor may use this resource to support students, as needed, in gaining the skills to cope and work through those big emotions in a safe, risk-free environment so they can refocus on academic learning. No specific certification/training is required to use this resource. Before using this resource with a student, parents are notified and can opt out.

## 5.6 Student Travel-PWR Science Camp-Pull as separate

I'm concerned that while the assignment itself is aimed at fostering critical thinking and understanding of the impact of human population and consumption on Earth's systems, it may lead to unnecessary conversations about climate change and other ideologies. Also, how do we ensure that the curriculum aligns with Arizona educational standards and guidelines since the staff at the camp will be facilitating.

#### Earth and Space Science

#### Cycle Factory

The students will join us at our "cycle factory" where they will learn about the water, soil, and air cycles. Using that knowledge, students will build a "tree" in a relay-style race. They will wear hardhats and use wiffle balls, chutes, pulleys, fake toilets, and imagination to build that model tree as well as discuss how pollution can enter each cycle and what humans can do to reduce and mitigate pollution.

We contacted Legal and here is their response:

The Notification is appropriate and legal as written and will serve your District well if a complaint is filed against the District with the Office for Civil Rights or the Department of Justice. The matter of what "sex" includes has been decided by the U.S. Supreme Court in *Bostock*. What is being litigated is mostly issues of bathroom or locker room access by trans students. Almost all cases are being found in favor of the trans students.

#### CTE INTERNSHIP DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY DPIN401A/DPIN402B

MEETS CTE or ELECTIVE REQUIREMENT

The CTE Internship Program has been created as a supplement to formal classroom instruction. #### HONORS ENVIRONMENTAL & SUSTAINABILITY ENGINEERING EG303WA/EG304WB

MEETS CTE or ELECTIVE REQUIREMENT

Environmental Sustainability is a high school-level specialization course in PLTW Engineering. In this course students investigate and design solutions to solve real-world challenges related to clean drinking water, a stable food supply, and renewable energy. Students are introduced to environmental issues and use the engineering design process to research and design potential solutions. Utilizing the Activity-Project-Problem-Based (APM) teaching and learning pedagogy, students transition from completing structured activities to solving open-ended projects and problems that require them to develop planning, documentation, communication, and other professional skills. Through both induvial and collaborative team activities, projects, and problems, students problem solve as they practice common design and scientific protocols such as project management, lab techniques, and peer review. Students develop skills in designing experiments, conducting research, executing technical skills, documenting design solutions according to accepted technical standards, and creating presentations to communicate solutions. ADE CTE approved program – ADE course title: Advanced Engineering III.

#### HONORS CIVIL ENGINEERING AND ARCHITECTURE EG305WA/EG306WB

MEETS CTE OR ELECTIVE REQUIREMENT

Civil Engineering and Architecture (CEA) students are introduced to important aspects of building, site design and development. They apply math, science, and standard engineering practices to design both residential and commercial projects and document their work using 3D architectural design software. Utilizing the activity project problem based (APM) teaching and learning pedagogy, students will progress from completing structured activities to solving open ended projects and problems that require them to develop planning, documentation, communication, and other professional skills. Through both individual and collaborative team activities, projects, and problems, students will solve problems as they practice common design and development protocols such as project representation, and documentation of design solutions according to accepted technical standards and use of current 3D architectural design and modeling software to represent and communication solutions.

Students learn how these concepts apply to a career in aerospace engineering and other engineering fields. Students are strongly encouraged to participate in SkillsUSA Student Association. ADE CTE approved program – ADE Course title: Advanced Engineering III.

Topics include behavior modification, enhancing motivation components of fitness, fitness assessment, risk stratification, exercise programming and modifications. This course will help prepare students to sit for Personal Trainer Certification. Observation hours in various off-campus and on-campus sports medicine settings will be required. Students are strongly encouraged to participate in the Health Occupations Student Association (HOSA). This course may be offered for dual credit and leads to various industry certifications. ADE/CTE approved program. ADE course title: Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation III.

We follow the college board guidelines and standards for AP Seminar. This course also meets the Arizona State Standards for English 10.

#### AP CAPSTONE: AP SEMINAR CP301WA/CP302WB

MEETS ENGLISH REQUIREMENT FOR 9<sup>th</sup> or 10<sup>th</sup> GRADE; MAY BE TAKEN IN LIEU OF HONORS ENGLISH 10

This yearlong course, students develop and strengthen analytic and inquiry skills, exploring two to four relevant issues chosen by the student and/or teacher. For example, students might explore the question of whether national security is more important than a citizen's right to privacy, or whether genetic engineering is a benefit to society. Using an inquiry framework, students practice reading and analyzing articles; research studies; foundational, literary, and philosophical texts; listening to and viewing speeches, broadcasts, and personal accounts; and experiencing artistic works and performances. Students learn to consider an issue from multiple perspectives, evaluate the strength of an argument, and make logical, fact-based decisions. Students question, research, explore, pose solutions, develop arguments, collaborate, and communicate using various media. After taking AP Seminar, students will have the opportunity to further hone their inquiry and analytical writing skills in AP Research. NOTE: This is a weighted course.

Pg 6 and 7-Why is Spanish/World Language being removed? Lack of interest?

We do not offer these pathways in HVA. They are the pathways that are at Sossaman and Cooley. This information should have been removed last year.

Pg 8-Why is Keyboarding being removed? Is it due to lack of interest? Lack of interest and low level of content.

Pg 9-Does any physical education actually take place, or do they just talk about sports and exercising? Also, please explain the diversity in sports and why it is necessary to have that embedded in the course?

Students have to participate in physical education activities, log their time, and submit videos to the teacher. We follow the curriculum that was approved when HVA was created in 2021.

#### **COMPREHENSIVE PHYSICAL EDUCATION MSPE899**

Team sports, extreme sports, and outdoor sports are among the types of activities students learn about and participate in during this course! This interactive course helps students learn safety rules for exercise, how to improve skills, and how to establish and accomplish goals. It also provides an overview of many dual, team, extreme, and outdoor sports. Practicing game strategy to improve the chance of winning in competition, improving sport skill and performance, diversity in sports, nutrition, peer pressure, and making good choices balance out the topics students discover in this course. Fitness logs help students monitor physical activities. Students complete projects that lead to the knowledge, skills, and values they need to implement and maintain a physically active lifestyle. Students also have the opportunity to earn a national award by participating in the Presidential Fitness Challenge.

#### FITNESS MSPE903A/MSPE904B

Students who want to be fit but don't know where to start are invited to join a diverse group of virtual classmates who help with exploring and understanding fitness and health. With the support of these virtual friends, students determine current personal fitness levels and learn to improve those levels. Students also learn safety rules for exercise, how to create equipment from household items, how different activities target different body parts, how to set and reach a goal, and qualities of sportsmanship. Students keep a log of physical fitness activities while exploring topics that include diversity in sports, nutrition, peer pressure, and making good choices. Each PE project leads to improved student understanding of personal skills and the environments in which activities are played.

Pg 26 Art History - This course is an opportunity for students to reflect on how art was and is used as a vehicle to communicate, depict political and religious propaganda, and serve as evidence of cultural shifts and changes.

Focusing extensively on art as a tool for communication and propaganda may introduce a potential ideological bias into the curriculum. Parents may be concerned that the course could inadvertently promote specific political or religious perspectives, leading to distrust in the objectivity of the educational content. A course with a heavy focus on political and religious themes may not align with the values of all parents and students within our district.

Pg 30 PE-How are the students monitored to ensure they are actually doing the weekly requirement?

Students have to submit logs and videos to the teacher.

Page 39-Why would we charge students for wanting to take a 7th course? What does the fee cover?

The 7<sup>th</sup> course is above and beyond the 6 courses required and funding is not received. The fee covers the cost of the teacher, curriculum, and supplies. The fee is consistent with what we charge for summer school online courses.

#### MS Course Guide

Pg 14-For fitness testing, can the tests be done separately by sex? Based on what told me last year, female students were not comfortable testing in the presence of boys because the boys would make fun of them, and the girls wouldn't put in much effort because they were too embarrassed. There was also a situation where the boys would videotape the girls running and then make comments about their bodies.

Students who are uncomfortable should talk with their teachers about the testing. Any situation where boys are recording girls running should be reported to site administration.

# **ELECTIVES – PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

#### MIDDLE SCHOOL PHYSICAL EDUCATION MSPE899 or MSPE900

This course introduces students to the importance of physical activity in order to live a longer, healthier, enjoyable life; including flexibility training and cardiovascular and strength development. Team sports, dual and individual, are emphasized. Units in Team Sports may include Basketball, Football, Lacrosse Soccer, Volleyball, Hockey, Baseball/Softball and Team Handball, as well as fitness focused training. Students will also gain an understanding of individual fitness levels and will obtain the skills to self-analyze through practical applications. This course will cover areas in lifetime sports. Lifetime sports is designed for all students interested in improving their overall personal fitness. Students will explore the relationship between exercise and personal wellness. Students will assess their current fitness level, identify areas for improvement and set goals for achievement. Lifetime Sports 1 is a blend of fitness activities and recreational sports which may include badminton and whiffle ball. A health-related physical fitness test may be administered once each semester. This is a moderately active course and specific attire may be required. This course may be repeated.

What constitutes a "policy" vs a "procedure"? Per this policy, will the superintendent actually establish procedures or policies for animals in the classroom.

I'd like to change the verbiage to read "The board directs the superintendent to develop procedures consistent with the policy to appropriately and humanely bring live animals into a classroom to be approved by the board."

The Superintendent may establish procedures for appropriately and humanely bringing live animals into a classroom. Such procedures shall forbid the transporting of live animals that are not service animals on school buses.

The procedures are already established and are outlined in the regulations and exhibits. The board doesn't approve procedures (regulations) so therefore that language proposed contradicts the policy (see policy BGD).
