Here are the big things from our meeting last night. We also had an amazing experience at our quarterly Board Breakfast a couple weeks ago. We visited and learned about the "Smart Desk" at the high school, staffed entirely by students. I will give a more detailed report in March!

- 1. The Board formally approved the **Board Goals for 2017.** They continue to be based on the Strategic Plan initiatives for 2015-2020. These are:
 - Safety and Security
- Professional Learning Communities
 - STEAM
- Technology (with emphasis on implementing the 1:1 initiative at the high school)
- the High School Experience

2. Report of Capital Projects ad hoc committee:

Our architect, Dave McLean, presented answers to several questions raised by stakeholders and other board members, in preparation for bringing a formal recommendation to the Board. Our finance team is also refining potential costs and financing options, based on the various project scenarios. A final report and recommendation by the ad hoc committee to the full Board will be upcoming in the next 1-2 months.
