Stacey presented updates from the PTC meeting. The students will be receiving ALICE training in Sept/Oct and parents will receive notification before the training occurs. Ray Carson will be attending our November General meeting and membership is invited to attend and hear more about the ALICE training. There will be an Open Mic with the district in November. The No Place for Hate program is going to be started for the whole district. Finally, the online verification emails should be out in October and then the District Directories will come out in November. So far 83% of families have completed back-to-school-online.

Mr. DeMar mentioned that fall sports were well under way and that the transition into the new school year had been smooth.

Amy mentioned the positive and smooth start to the school year in the district and that Dr Rozzo is now a full year into his service as Superintendent of Schools in the district.

The School Board is happy to have two student representatives Karsen Damon and Gabriella Spina as members this year.

Lauren Madia has been named Assistant Director of Student Support Services, and the director position is still open at this time.

Amy provided an update on the construction project mentioning that the administration building at the stadium is almost complete. Move in for the administration staff will happen in mid-October and there is a temporary occupancy permit for the concession stand and restrooms for the football game. The swimming pool part of the project is slow and behind schedule. The contractors are working very hard to complete the project by the first High School swim meet, but the main hold up has been labor related. On a positive note the entire project is under budget with less than half of the contingency being used.
