Domino's has detailed product handling guidelines covering how and where the pizza dough should be proofed, how long the product should be baked and at what temperature, as well as how to properly mark boxes when pizza comes out of the oven and the timeframe in which it should be delivered.

Ready to Serve Pizza

Domino's Smart Slice pizzas are packed in food-safe corrugated boxes which are SFI (Sustainable Forestry Initiative) certified. The pizzas are delivered in our proprietary "Heatwave" bags which are designed to hold the pizzas at 170° F for up to 20 minutes. Pizzas are delivered to school cafeterias by Domino's delivery drivers in their personal car to an entrance determined by the cafeteria manager at each delivery site.

Menu Labeling: Nutritional Analysis Accuracy

Domino's Smart Slice uses the industry standard Genesis R&D SQL Nutritional Software to generate nutritional facts for Menu Labeling. The software is widely used by food manufacturers and food service companies that need to comply with nutritional labeling requirements. The software is also recognized by and used by the USDA and FDA. Domino's Pizza Quality Assurance uses the software to automatically generate the nutrition facts panel using Domino's Smart Slice menu item builds. Domino's Quality Assurance uses only Approved Suppliers who are required to provide 100 grams ingredient nutrition analysis which is used to develop the nutrition facts panel.

Operationally, the sauce is prepped into clean tubs for immediate use, or stored under refrigeration until it is needed. The quality and food safety of the opened prepped sauce at the store level is maintained with employee training in proper hygienic food safe practices (eGMP's) and criteria of the Public Health Sanitary Code for Retail Food Establishments. The prepared sauce is able to be held on the counter without temperature control for up to 8 hours.

Tumwater School District Board Policy

TITLE I PARENT AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

The Board recognizes that parent involvement significantly contributes to the achievement of academic standards by students participating in district programs. The Board views the education of students as a cooperative effort among school, parents and community. The Board expects that its schools will carry out programs, activities and procedures in accordance with the statutory definition of parent involvement. Parent involvement means the participation of parents in regular, two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, including ensuring that parents:

- 1. Play an integral role in assisting their child's learning;
- 2. Are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education; and

The Board recognizes that parents play an important role in a child's education. In recognizing that role, the Board respects parents as partners in the decision-making process for their children's education. When teachers and parents communicate and share similar high and realistic expectations for student achievement and behavior, students can be expected to learn more and perform better in school.

In using these terms, the Board recognizes that families within our community vary in family composition, cultural backgrounds, abilities, financial resources, and belief structures.

Schools also need the support of other members of the community including parent organizations, public agencies, businesses, civic and faith-based organizations to support effective education. The District will create partnerships with community organizations that promote education as an investment in the community. Community groups and parents will be encouraged to help schools develop and implement innovative programs that advance educational goals and support high academic achievement for all students.

The Board of Directors adopts as part of this policy the following guidance for parent involvement. The District shall:

1. Put into operation programs, activities and procedures for increasing the involvement of parents in all of its schools consistent with federal and state laws including Title I and the Learning Assistance Program (LAP). Those programs, activities, and procedures will be planned, implemented, and evaluated with meaningful consultation from parents of participating children:

The 2020-2026 Capital Facilities Plan was presented at a public hearing during the September 10, 2020 Board meeting and a Determination of Non-Significance was issued under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA). No comments or suggested changes were received from either of these actions.

Our attorney reviewed the Plan and found an incorrect entry in the impact fee formula, which caused the fee for multi-family housing to be lower than it should have been. While the *cost* of the newly completed Tumwater Learning Center was removed from the formula, the *credit* for a State construction grant for the project was not. Removing the credit along with the cost corrects the multi-family impact fee and it aligns with the historical fee. A revised impact fee calculation is attached to this memo and the entire Plan can be found on the Capital Projects portion of the TSD website.

The proposed impact fees for 2020 shown below have a discount applied of 65% for single-family homes and 10% for multi-family homes. Impact fees as calculated may be discounted by an amount at the discretion of the Board.

WHEREAS, the Tumwater School District No. 33 (hereinafter referred to as "the District") is responsible for providing public educational services at the elementary, middle, and high school levels to students now residing or who will reside in the District; and

WHEREAS, new residential developments have major impacts on the public school facilities in the District; and

WHEREAS, the Growth Management Act (GMA) authorizes a local government to collect impact fees to ensure that adequate facilities are available to serve new growth and development; and

WHEREAS, the State Subdivision Act requires that subdivisions make adequate provisions for schools and school grounds; and

WHEREAS, the District desires to cooperate with the City of Tumwater and Thurston County in implementation of the State Subdivision Act in imposing appropriate mitigating conditions upon development; and

WHEREAS, the District has studied the need for additional school facilities to serve new developments and has developed a Six-Year Capital Facilities Plan for the years 2020-2026; and

WHEREAS, the District has reviewed the cost of providing school facilities needed to serve new development and evaluated the need for new revenues to finance additional facilities; and

WHEREAS, the District has determined there is not sufficient capacity at many of the existing school facilities to accommodate additional students that will be generated by new development unless additional land is acquired and new schools are built; and

WHEREAS, the cumulative effect of additional development is to create additional demand and need for school facilities which cannot be met without the imposition of school impact fees; and

WHEREAS, the impact fee calculations are consistent with methodologies meeting the conditions and tests of RCW 82.02 and the City of Tumwater and Thurston County school impact fee ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the District has determined that the District's Capital Facilities Plan provides for a schedule of impact fees for each type of development activity set forth in the Capital Facilities Plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Tumwater School District No. 33, Thurston County, Washington, as follows:

- 1. - The Board of Directors of the Tumwater School District No. 33 requests the City of Tumwater and Thurston County to adopt the Capital Facilities Plan 2020-2026 as a part of their capital facilities plan elements and that the Plan be used as a basis for imposition impact fees under the GMA.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of Tumwater School District No. 33, Thurston County, Washington, adopts the Capital Facilities Plan 2020-2026 for said purposes stated herein.
