The Scholarship for Military Children Program Feb 16th Deadline

The Scholarship for Military Children Program will award a minimum of one \$2,000 scholarship at each commissary that has qualified applicants. A student may only receive a scholarship for up to four years. Exceptions can be considered if a student is enrolled in an undergraduate program that normally requires more than 4 years. All exceptions will be handled on an individual basis. Excepting extremely unusual circumstances, the awards cannot be deferred for future use; the awards must be used for educational expenses incurred during the 2018-2019 Academic Year. Awards are made without regard to race, creed, color, gender, sexual orientation, religious belief, national origin, rank or service of the sponsor. Applications must be turned in to the Commissary by the posted deadline.

Leadership 1000 Scholarship

Feb 28th Deadline

The Leadership 1000 Scholarship is a scholarship program funded by individuals, foundations or businesses to provide college scholarships to students who will be attending an eligible four-year college or university in Washington State. A Leadership 1000 Scholarship can be customized around a general set of requirements requested by the donor. Scholarships awarded will range from \$1,500 to \$5,000. Some requirements include Plan to attend, or currently be attending, an eligible four-year college or university in Washington State. Be a Washington state resident, Plan to enroll as a college freshman, sophomore or junior in fall 2018.

Plan to file or have already filed a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), if eligible. Students unable to file a FAFSA due to immigration status must complete the free Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA).

Have a family income for 2016 that does not exceed the amount listed by family size in chart. Maintain a minimum 2.75 cumulative high school GPA through fall quarter/semester, if applying as a high school senior. For more information about this application, go to

Washington State Opportunity Scholarship (STEM) Feb 28th Deadline

(Opens Jan 2nd)

Our scholarship supports low- and middle-income Washington students pursuing eligible high-demand majors in science, technology, engineering, math (STEM) or health care and encourages recipients to work in Washington State once they complete their degrees. Must be pursuing an eligible high-demand major (Approved Majors, Alphabetically) in science, technology, engineering, math (STEM) or health care.

1. Have a high school diploma or GED by June 30, 2018. *(Running Start students must provide a copy of their high school diploma or GED.)

2. Have a strong academic record, a minimum of a 3.0 cumulative GPA.

3. Plan to attend Centralia College as a full-time student (minimum of 12 college credits each quarter).

4. Apply for admission to Centralia College and receive Student Identification Number (SID#). SID# is required on the scholarship application. To apply for admission visit: <u>www.centralia.edu/admissions</u>. Allow a minimum of 3 - 5 business days to receive your SID#. Apply early!


MTS community service opportunity:


Cost is Free - Including child care!
