Courses

Required Core Courses

- English, Math, Social Studies & Science
- Aligned mostly by grade level
- Leveled based on teacher recommendation

Electives

- All other non-core subjects (Business, Art, Music, Tech Ed, FCS & PE)
- Some are mandatory

Courses

- Core Courses have <u>levels</u> in HS:
 - General (not listed next to course, ex. Biology)
 - College Prep (ex. College Prep Biology)
 - Honors
 - Advanced Placement
 - College in the High School (CHS)
 - Dual Enrollment
- Courses are assigned <u>credit</u> value.



Credit

- The unit of measurement assigned to courses.
 - Course meets for one MP (45 days) = .5 credit
 - Course meets for two MPs/One Semester (90 days)
 - = 1 credit
 - Courses that meet all year = 2 credits






