WHAT DOES A MUTUALLY BENEFICIAL JOB CORPS AND COMMUNITY COLLEGE PARTNERSHIP LOOK LIKE?

- Community colleges gain a pipeline of new students who have a strong base of knowledge in their fields of study.
- Job Corps will support its graduates at your school by providing them with access to housing, basic medical care, and transportation, allowing the students to focus on their studies.
- Ability to share state-of-the-art equipment and facilities.
- Expand professional networks and marketing reach.

JOB CORPS:

- **Tuition-free** to income-eligible 16- through 24-year-olds.
- **Hands-on training programs** that take at least 18 months to complete.
- **Educational advancement opportunities**, such as high school diploma and equivalent programs, Advanced Training to earn additional certifications, and community college partnerships that allow Job Corps students to take college-level classes.
- **Professional skill-building** in areas such as effective communication, resume writing, networking, community service, and teamwork.
- **123 residential and nonresidential locations** nationwide.
