WHAT IS AN **APPRENTICESHIP?**

- A successful and realistic option for Job Corps graduates that is based on a "learn while you earn" model that combines onthe-job training with job-related instruction and curriculum.
- Hands-on training opportunities based on national skills standards and provided by employers.
- Most programs last between 1 and 2 years, are flexible, and can be customized to meet the needs of a particular business.
- Apprentices can be no younger than 16 years old, and most programs require individuals to be at least 18.



WHY APPRENTICESHIPS ARE **A GREAT OPTION** FOR JOB CORPS GRADUATES:



Additional hands-on career training: Apprentices receive extensive hands-on training from an experienced mentor that focuses on the specific skills and knowledge needed to be fully proficient on the job.

- Additional education: Many programs have education partners such as community colleges and technical schools that collaborate with national and local employers to develop the curriculum and offer opportunities for college credit and future degrees.

Increased earnings: Apprentices begin earning wages their first day in the program and receive pay increases as they meet benchmarks for skill attainment. The average starting wage for an apprentice is \$15 per hour.



National credential: Apprentice graduates earn a certified portable credential accepted by industries and employers across the United States and often globally.

- Instructors and counselors assist students with applying to Apprenticeships once they've completed their Pre-Apprenticeship program.


