NOTICE to ALL DRIVERS



Vehicle must be inspected prior to every departure. Complete the inspection sheet to confirm and record the results of your inspection.

Check your vehicle for Spotted Lanternfly (SLF) egg masses from late fall to early spring. These egg masses may be underneath your vehicle or in your wheel wells. During all other times of year, check for nymphs and adults. Keep your windows rolled up when you park. Avoid parking beneath trees. If you are towing a trailer, you are also required to inspect the trailer and cargo before departure.

If you find any of these life stages of the Spotted Lanternfly, remove, devitalize, place in a sealed bag, and dispose of bag in the garbage.
