The St. Clair County Board of Education invites you to bid on <u>Online Social Emotional Learning Early</u> <u>Warning Biopsychosocial Assessment</u> for the school system.

The contract will begin <u>August 3, 2021</u> upon board approval. This contract is for one school year, and can be extended up to four additional years.

- The bid will be awarded to the lowest bidder meeting specifications. In the event the low bidder refuses to accept the entire requirements without deviation, the bid may be awarded to the next lowest bidder. The St. Clair County Board of Education maintains the right to terminate this agreement if successful bidder breaches any material term or condition of this agreement and fails to cure such in a reasonable amount of time.
- The St. Clair County Board of Education reserves the right to reject any and/or all bids.
- All bids envelopes must be sealed and marked with the following in the lower left corner: **Bid #**, **Name of the Bid, Opening Time & Date, and Company Name.** Late Bids will not be opened.
- Bids may be disqualified before awarding of the contract for failure to mark envelope as required, failure to include requested information or other details of the bid, and excessive errors.
- Prices should be good for the length of the contract. The contract will be based on a period of 12 months.

Section 1.00 Administrative Overview

1.1 Purpose and Background

Purpose:

The St. Clair County Board of Education (SCCBOE) is seeking responses to this Bid from Sole Source Proposers for the purchase of K-12 Social Emotional Learning Early Warning Assessment. The SCCBOE is seeking products and services as described in this Bid Specifications to support early warning assessments in all K-12 18 base schools which includes daily biopsychosocial check-in assessments. A daily biopsychosocial is defined for our purposes as an assessment that comprehensively gauges the biological, psychological, and socio-environmental factors of a student. Our current needs are to acquire an early warning assessment and a fully managed Learning Management System (LMS) that provides analytical data that shows the mental health progression of students throughout the school year. This is in direct alignment with the school system's vision to drive the Social Emotional progress of every student equitably. SCCBOE cannot guarantee the number of users in any given year.

Background:

In 2020-21, the ALSDE offered a grant with to provide a new employment position for LEA's with the title Mental Health Liaison (titled in the State as Mental Health Services Coordinator). This position was created to enhance and grow mental health services throughout the LEA. The Mental Health Liaison is commissioned to work within all 3 tiers to make mental health services available to all students.

How?

The Mental Health Liaison pursues resources, funding, and collaboratives to foster a wholistic environment for thriving mental health. In addition to these functions, the Mental Health Liaison works to implement new Social Emotional Learning programs.

2.1 Scope of Vendor's Work and Responsibilities

OPTION 1 – SCCBOE System - wide Online Social Emotional Learning Early Warning Biopsychosocial Assessment

The St. Clair County Board of Education (SCCBOE) is requesting proposals from qualified providers that will provide all 17 base schools a Online Social Emotional Learning Early Warning Biopsychosocial Assessment which provides accessibility and tracking.

SCCBOE is looking for an early warning system that provides a Biopsychosocial assessment. This program must address Tier 1 and Tier 2 of the school-based mental health model of all students receiving prevention education and peers working to support and identify at-risk students. Additionally, the program must focus to increase school safety through early identification of at-risk students, minimizing disciplinary infractions including school suspensions and expulsions. The program must provide relevant therapeutic activities for all students based on their individual mental health needs. The programs therapeutic activities must be evidence based. Any applicable prevention activities must be comprehensive and satisfy the following mandates: Jamari Terrell Williams Act, Erin's Law, Jason Flatt Act as well as the Drug and Alcohol Education requirements as they relate to the students. In addition, the early warning assessment without the use of the therapeutic activities. - Tier 1 Early Warning Biopsychosocial Assessment
- Tier 2 identifying and supporting at-risk students through therapeutic activities
- Evidence-based program
- Increase school safety through reported early identification of at-risk students
- Data collection in real time must include all three stated student group numbers (number of students engaged in the program, number of students supported, and the number of students referred to adults at risk)
- Program training for LEA and School Administration Training and Program Coordinator

Programs must be structured and turnkey for ease of implementation, yet customizable enough to adjust to meet the mental health needs of students at each SCC campus. SCCBOE beginning August 2021-2022 school year.
