Principal's Message

In the month of December, we will begin administering a couple of important benchmarks for learning. The first week in December, students will take a Fastbridge eReading assessment. This is a computer-administered adaptive screening that measures broad reading ability and predicts overall reading achievement. In order to take an Advanced Reading class (7th grade) or Advanced ELA class (8th grade) a student must score in the college proficiency range (70th percentile) and score at a 3 or 4 on the Kansas State Assessment.

Students will also take the Kansas State Assessment Interim in Math and English from December 7-12. This assessment gives us a good understanding of the critical skills a student may be lacking and allows our staff to get a better understanding of what skills need to be retaught.

Lastly, on January 10 students will take their iReady winter benchmark in Math. This diagnostic will show us how much each student has learned so far this year in Math. Our goal is for each student to show at least 50% of a years growth by the winter diagnostic. If a student is interested in taking Advanced Math as a 7th or 8th grader, they must score at a 3 or 4 on the Kansas State Assessment and score in the 80th percentile on their winter iReady diagnostic.

Our goal is to create an environment where students and staff have a growth mindset and use the results of these assessments to celebrate how far they have come and to challenge themselves with future learning goals. If you are wondering how you can help your student with Math, you can always have them login to their personalized learning path in iReady. Students login to this through Clever.

We encourage all of our students to do their best on these assessments!
