




Receive Important Alerts

Steps to Success: Communicating with Your Child's School

We strive to be the best place to learn. The only way we can improve is to know about concerns so we are able to address them. Here are some tips for communicating with your child's school when concerns arise. The fastest way to a positive result is to start with the people closest to the situation in the school. Talk with the teacher or coach about your questions and concerns before going to the principal. Parents and guardians are encouraged to reach out to teachers and school staff by:

- Calling the school's phone number. Because they are teaching, you often will need to leave a message for your child's teacher or coach.
- Emailing the teacher or coach directly. All teacher emails are available on our school website. We want to be responsive to parents' questions and requests for information. Our staff will respond to your call or email as soon as possible, in most cases within 2 school days.

If you have had a conversation with your child's teacher and the principal and are still needing assistance, the director of secondary programs will be able to provide additional support.

We are excited for this new school year and look forward to partnering with you to support a great school experience for your student.

La forma más rápida de obtener un resultado positivo es comenzar con las personas más cercanas a la situación en la escuela. Hable con el maestro o entrenador acerca de sus preguntas e inquietudes antes de ir al director. Se alienta a los padres y tutores a comunicarse con los maestros y el personal de la escuela por:

- Llamando al número de teléfono de la escuela. Debido a que están enseñando, a menudo deberá dejar un mensaje para el maestro o entrenador de su hijo.
- Enviar un correo electrónico al maestro o entrenador directamente. Todos los correos electrónicos de los maestros están disponibles en el sitio web de nuestra escuela.

Queremos responder a las preguntas y solicitudes de información de los padres. Nuestro personal responderá a su llamada o correo electrónico lo antes posible, en la mayoría de los casos dentro de los 2 días escolares. Si ha tenido una conversación con el maestro de su hijo y el director y aún necesita ayuda, el director de los programas de primaria o secundaria podrá brindarle apoyo adicional. Directory Information

In accordance with Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), USD 305 has designated certain information as directory information. This information is considered public information which may be released from the school district without your prior consent. Please inform your school building in writing that any or all of the directory information should not be released without your prior consent (by September 8, 2023 to ensure it is not included in a parent directory). The following information is considered directory information:

- I. The student's name and age
- II. Parent's name, address and telephone number
- III. The student's major field of study and class designation(i.e. first grade, tenth grade)
- IV. The student's participation in officially recognized activities or sports
- V. The weight and height of members of athletic teams
- VI. Dates of attendance (period of time during which a student was enrolled in an educational agency or institution, i.e. academic year, spring semester)

Información de Directorio

En conformidad con los Derechos Educativos de la Familia y Ley de Privacidad (FERPA), USD 305 ha designado cierta información como información de directorio. Esta información es considerada información pública que el distrito escolar puede publicar sin su consentimiento previo. Por favor informe a su escuela por escrito de cualquier o toda la información del directorio que no debe ser publicada sin su consentimiento previo (para el 8 de septiembre, 2023 para asegurar que no esté incluida en el directorio para padres). La siguiente información se considera información del directorio:

- I. El nombre del estudiante y edad
- II. Nombre de los padres, dirección y número de teléfono I
- II. Campo principal de estudio del estudiante y designación de clases (ejemplo, primer grado, décimo grado)
- IV. Participación del estudiante en actividades oficialmente reconocidas o deportes
- V. El peso y estatura de integrantes de equipos atléticos
- VI. Fechas de asistencia (período de tiempo durante el cual un estudiante se inscribió en una agencia educativa o institución, ejemplo, año académico, semestre de primavera)



Medication At School

When the administration of a medication either prescribed or over-the-counter is required during school hours, the school can provide the service. Kansas law requires written permission from the parent and a signed order from the physician for prescription medication.

Prescription Medication: The medication is to be brought to the school in the original container appropriately labeled by the pharmacy, or physician, stating the name of the medication, the dosage, and the time to be administered.

Over the Counter Medication: LMS requires only a parent signature for dosing as recommended. Please send over-the-counter medication in a small bottle. We do not stock over-the-counter medication in the building.
