
1. Please select the group which you feel best describes your involvement with the BUUSD: 265 responses




Where do you find information about the BUUSD Budget? Check all that apply. 265 responses

If you voted for the school budget...

Please feel free to explain.

I work in the district and I also have a son in the district. As a parent I don't want my child to lose out on opportunities that all the other students of Barre have had from class options to sports. As a tax payer I feel the school budget is a reasonable price compared to the blown out municipal budget.

Education is an investment. If you don't properly fund schools you will not have a successful school, which will in turn, not produce successful, functioning members of society.

What kind of statement is this? I will vote yes.

Good concessions made. Would like automatic increases for administrators cut.

Teachers need to be supported - if we deduct anything it should be from administration I am against additional taxes, or raising taxes, but i will always vote for the school budget regardless.

Our budget is bare bones as it is and our students (and my children) deserve better. Our programs and supplies are lacking, our fields and buildings need updates, we need resource officers to deal with out of control behaviors, our teachers are leaving because of the poor conditions. etc etc.

as a parent i always voted in support of the school budget i understand my tax dollars are an investment in my child's future

I feel it is important to keep the schools fully funded. There cannot continue to be cuts that impact students and staff in any way.

School needs to be well funded. Public education is a foundation of being an informed citizen. We need informed citizens more than ever. We need string music programs, monies for supplies, field trips, enrichment programs.

We are short staffed. We are making positive changes in the right direction, however we do not have adequate staffing to provide the MTSS model as it should be. Intervention is often providing special education services, leaving tier 2 needs unmet. Special Education services are often interrupted to fill other roles, leaving already sparse services (services should be at LEAST 4 days a week and they aren't because there isn't enough staff to meet those needs) unmet. If we want to see positive change, if we want to have MTSS implemented in the way in which it was meant to be, and see increased student performance, we NEED to increase tier 2 and tier 3 services to meet the needs of the at risk and special education population. While I don't want an increase in my taxes, staff is burning out trying to fill in too many roles, and not being successful due to not enough staff as it is. Cutting from the budget, reducing salaries and/or benefits will only drive more staff away, leaving new untrained teachers to fill those roles without adequate background and skills to meet the needs of a very high needs population.

I voted for the budget because I always feel that are students do not have the opportunities that our neighboring districts have. U23's 7th and 8th grade goes to Washington DC every other year.

Montpelier goes to Montreal. We do not teach out students life experiences or life skills. I think travel and thinking outside the box of Barre Vermont is really important. I think when you take a foreign language like Spanish in high school and there's no trip for the upper levels of Spanish, I think that's a disappointment because we hear of other high school's doing things. This year our own Middle schools at Barre Town hired a new band teacher, who seems nice, and he declined to take the students to the Great Escape field trip that happens every year because he's new and figuring things out. He wants to go next year. But....kids rarely go anywhere in our district. I think it's important to start thinking outside the box and figuring out how we can make things happen. Band at SHS used to play for Myrtle beach. That's no longer. But other districts do it. Why can't Barre? The other thing is that when I constantly vote yes. Because my kids aren't on IEP's or 504's....I think a lot of time, the people we hire like social worker or an extra counselor...those people do not work with everyone. They work with a certain group, who yes need it., but what about my kids needs for being pushed? Or excelling? I actually asked for a lunch bunch group for my middle schooler and got denied because everyone is stretched thin. I think that certain groups of kids take over the needs and what other kids want. I vote yes because I hope one day that my money goes towards something my kids want or need. And the first things to cut are always things that are "extra's". So, I vote yes constantly. But I am hopeful that our district will make changes. And I'm hopeful that we can think of all kids needs and not just a certain group. It's hard.

You have already cut everything there is to cut and are reducing the quality of education our kids receive, limiting access to opportunities to thrive in the modern workplace.

I know the schools offer many forms of support for our youth.

I wanted to see continued investment in school and students

Generally speaking paying for public school is a cost of society. We all want our towns to be lively and grow with good jobs and development and that all starts at the school level. The school operates on razor thin budgets as is, the request was not unreasonable. Cost everywhere are up.

We as a community need to do our part.

Our taxes are too high but it is not the fault of the kids or our staff.

I know many in our community are under tremendous stress when it comes to property taxes - I am, too. With inflation, broadbased taxes, etc., I often find I am not able to provide all the opportunities I wish I could for my children. However, school is their second home, and there will

be no "re do's" for their education and brain, and social skills development. To be clear, I think there are many things that could be done better in the school, and we need to transform and evolve how we are delivering education and reinvigorate enthusiasm in to the staff, and do more to welcome parents and the community in to the school on a regular basis, but until that work is done, we have to fund the status-quo, and I don't want my children to have less than they currently have right now. I wish there were MORE enrichment activities, field trips, STEM labs for grades PK-3 (and no waitlist for PreK plus full day), potential investment in literacy and numeracy curriculum that is data driven (science of reading) with comensurate training for teachers if needed, having the K-3 students put on spring concerts, etc., etc., and I am willing to pay for that. I just don't want my kids to have less, and I am worried that some of the cuts made will result in less.

Our students need everything and anything they need to be successful.

I trust our elected representatives to build a Budget that accurately reflects the needs for educating our children.

I voted yes for both budgets because I don't want to see any further cuts for my children. However, I do struggle with the unecessary spending and money going towards administration in the central office versus more going towards offering greater opportunities for our students. I totally understand and agree that kids are costing more due to their needs. It is frustrating as a tax payer to see other schools in our community offering so much more (albeit that their communities are voting yes on budgets), but we keep offering the absolute minimum. The children in our community and our schools deserve to have everything they could possibly need. Voting down the budget only hurts our kids!!!

I am concerned about not investing in the future. It is time to look at consolidating schools because the vocal Barre Town people no longer care about education but about the bottom line. I am concerned about the tax increase but am more concerned about cuts to critical programs in our school.

We need to do better for our students. The pandemic caused a drop in scores and an uptick in behavior issues. These are not going to be fixed quickly. Even though the pandemic is over the student needs have not ended. It is important to invest in our students as they are our future leaders.

While I agree that our taxes are higher than needed and the spending per pupil is astronomical I feel that the things that would get cut would be to the detriment of my child.

I voted for the school budget because I think it is crucial to properly fund our schools. I consider education an investment. I also feel like it is essential to pay competitive wages to attract the best possible educators, administrators, and central office staff.

I believe we need to support our schools. So much was lost when covid hit, we need to be adding resources not cutting them.

Because I feel that the future of our children is worth investing in and I don't want important cuts to be made.

We have one of the lowest per pupil spending in the state. Our schools are already underfunded compared to neighboring schools. We have been making cuts for well over a decade and there's no more fat to trim. I'm worried about what my daughter will be missing in terms of resources and opportunities even with the budget increases. So much is outside of the control of the schools and district when it comes to how the state allocates money and healthcare premiums. We can only control so much and we, as a community, ask our students to do without or do with less while other districts spend more and get more. By keeping our budgets so low for so long we have inadvertently been subsidizing districts like Montpelier and Stowe. We fail to make investments in our schools and then wonder why things aren't better. We're not going to cut our way to better teaching or test scores. We also need to stop thinking a public school should be operated as a business. It's not it's a public service and one where a poorer community like ours needs more investment, not less. We hear these cries of too much in taxes but compared to what? Many of our poorer neighbors are insulated from increasing property taxes. I know things are more expensive but that's true for schools too. I'm also tired of hearing massive property owners like Paul Malone complain about taxes and the schools. He's not longer an elected official yet the board lets him back seat drive constantly. I'm sorry but just because you're impacted by being massively wealthy doesn't give you more say in how things are done. Why are we letting him and others let their properties rot so they can collect tax rebates while our kids go without? For all those reasons, I vote yes and if I could raise the budget more, I would. If we continue on this path, I am seriously considering moving to a new school district where I know my kid will be afforded all the educational opportunities and resources they need and deserve. Our per pupil spending is in line with and/or lower than other districts in Vermont. The increase in tax rates is a problem created by the State and decisions about health care.... how school is funded is a separate issue that VT politicians need to figure out. Barre schools need the funding that was determined by school admin and the board. It is a fiscally responsible budget in terms of per pupil spending.

I'm an educator who values consistency in staff and the only way to do that is compensation to prove our staff is valued

As a teacher and a parent, I see the good and the bad. I see the things we ARE able to offer students that I don't want to lose. I am willing to pay a bit more to ensure that the children in my community have what they need to thrive, and what the teachers need to do their jobs. We have the 3rd largest school in the state and we're still at or near the bottom of cost per pupil. Sad. I hear from the school board that "people need to see results from their investment". Wtf is this!? They're kids, not Apple stock. If you won't pay teacher's or at least the minimum amount of teachers required for the school how will anything get better? So much talk has been about \$ and not the quality of education that kids deserve. There is a reason why people have lost respect for teachers and it starts with the school board. If they won't respect them, how will the public? It seemed reasonable given the various constraints placed upon Barre right now and given the challenges facing education

Want to support education, but very frustrated because the funding formula is broken.

Education is an investment that has an immediate impact as well as a long-term return. Since much of this community remains local and within the state long-term, if Vermont would like well-educated citizens and workers, the investment needs to start when schooling starts. It cannot be postponed only until HS or College because youth won't get that far without a solid base. Educating responsable, accountable youth means having educated, responsable, and accountable adult workers in the near and long-term future.

As a parent of children with disabilities at BTMES, we need more resources. Resources are disproportionately dispersed so that Barre Town students have to go with less. My children have been asked to stay home because they don't have support substitutes. This denies them the right to FAPE. Staff need to be trained and not by in house employees. We need money for that. There needs to be a huge culture shift within the district supporting and including neurodivergent and disabled students. Without, bullying will continue and teachers will leave and para positions won't be filled because students needs aren't being met. It's time to collaborate. It's time to realize that teaching has evolved into so much more. Teachers who had their training 10 years ago, even 5 years ago need more and better training to support the students of today. Find creative solutions. Most schools in other states ask parents to provide school supplies, have a school supply drive over the summer, involving the community to find supplies that way. The more you involve the community the more they will see the need.

Schools need resources to function. Our students deserve full staffed, fully funded schools for their education.

I know that the school budget being voted.down will ultimately not affect my tax rate too much but will adversely affect everything about the school. Much of the rise in rates is due to factors beyond local control.

Despite my frustrations with increasing taxes and displeasure in BTMES, my kids need quality education and not supporting the budget is not the way to get the message of frustration across. I am hopeful that a new superintendent and a new principal will bring about the changes many of the Barre Town families are looking for.

The work I wanted to see has now been done by the finance committee. Please stop just voting yes yes to support the administration without questions. There is a reason our current superintendent hasn't been hired elsewhere it's because he is untrustworthy.

I did not vote because I knew that it was going to fail. I also did not vote because of the dialogue from our board and because I do not trust the admin to spend the money appropriately. For example, with a fully funded budget, the current superintendent and principals cut all reading enrichment at Barre Town as well as other fully funded positions. So when they claim they need it for the kids, it is clear that they cannot be trusted to follow through and are more likely to give huge raises to non-teaching staff and administration.

The budget is too high. The return on investment is not there. Academic success of the students will not improve by throwing more money into the budget.

The budget is bloated. Let me be clear, voting no is not a reflection of the caliber of teaching staff. They are phenomenal. But are you paying them more with this budget increase? No. Find the waste and cut it. Free lunches? Other handouts? Are all of your programs running lean? Are the contracts fair? Please tell me why our student test scores are so abysmal despite having a healthy budget. I was always taught not to throw money at a problem. I will vote yes once a lean budget is proposed that cuts the WASTE. You have an obligation to the tax payers to do the best with the money given each year and you are failing. That is why your budget will keep failing in Barre Town. Because our generations were a part of the well-educated group of students of the past.

Increase is way too much. Move moneys around. Less enrollment should lessen costs.

I would feel confident in Barre, and its budget, if the members of the School Board resigned, along with the Superintendent, and an entirely new crew took over to create a reasonable, function group of adults who could leave the BUUSD. As it stands right now, I have zero confidence that those in charge have the best interest of our students at heart. The mass exodus of teachers from the Barre school system is not normal, and it should not continue to be ignored. The Board regularly tears down the teachers, coaches, and others influential in the education of our students. The cuts being asked for are too steep, but the Board is only hearing the angry voters who don't want to pay to educate the children of Barre. I would not support a budget that cuts even more funding from our schools.

If the money was truely going towards improving my childrens education. Taxs raise almost every year but the quality of academic and test score continues to drop. Student enrollment is down. Schools curriculum changes and addressing the grading process. More efficient teaching and no phones in school. Even teachers.

For my children to be getting an education. They need to teach everyday skills like telling time, addressing an envelope, making change, go back to teaching with text books and pencil and paper. These kids can't manage life without a computer.

Providing more money to people who are failing to provide a service to the community is not apt to fix the problem. So, I guess, creating a learning environment and teaching kids would help. Having kids who are advanced teach the rest of the class they are in amounts to child labor and teachers without license in your facility. Failing to provide consequences for poor behavior also creates a mental health crisis for the kids who are trying to learn.

Household costs stay the same or decrease. With everything else increasing, affordability is key. Actual fiscal responsibility and transparency rather than handwaving and 'why won't you vote to support the children' nonsense. Both my parents were public school teachers and I've never voted against a school budget before. But this was a blatant cash grab. I'd recommend starting with last year's budget, add the specialists that work on resolving academic weak areas and then perhaps a COLA (2-3%) for all staff. Total budget increase of maybe 5% or so. This would get a yes vote from me. Another token cut to the massive increase and I'll vote no again. That effort has been taken to go through the budget line by line. I do not have complete confidence in BUUSD CO leadership to provide a budget that meets the needs of both the community, students or staff members. Also, the Board needs to be able to figure out how to work together to come up with a plan that can be accepted versus openly arguing with each other. A compromise needs to occur to meet everyone's needs.

If there was a proposal to revamp resources. There seems to be wasted money on unnecessary things such as chrome books for every student, and promethium boards. Seems we need to pool resources so there is more staff support in schools. The lack of teachers and sustainability for the school system needs to be a focus. Everyone is burnt out, which trickles down to the kids. If I knew voting yes to the budget meant the money was going to the kids and classrooms, not for raises in central office.

NO SALARY INCREASES FOR CENTRAL OFFICE STAFF

Significant budget cuts, this budget has ballooned way too much under Chris Hennessey's tenor. Where are the savings of combining schools?

I am not registered to vote in Barre, but as a retired teacher, I support the school system and would vote Yes if I could.

Hire actual teachers that teach our kids. The school has gone downhill so badly since the pandemic. The kids aren't learning anything.

In all honesty, it boils down to not increasing property taxes. As it was, my family of five, who earns a six figure income per year, struggled to survive the past tax period. We fell behind and had to pay interest and late fees in top of everything. This last proposed budget would again increase taxes and make it even more challenging to afford to live here. Taxes keep going up, but our income does NOT. These constant increases are driving famailies out of vermont. We have a student to teacher ratio that is much higher than the national average. Change that. We are loosing more and more students in this state each year, yet the cost per pupil is higher?Look at any of the Govenor's suggested educational budget revisions - which were all exceptional yet rejected - and find something that will work.

I'm not a resident, but if I was I would have voted yes both times. In fact I feel the budget it too low

Funds actually going to students and teachers

The school is NOT meeting my child's needs. There are too many people working at central office that are not impacting student learning. We use to have twice the students with a quarter of the people in central office. The admin at BT are not addressing behavior issues to the point that my child did not feel safe there, and it was significantly impacting his learning. How can you expect people to vote yes to support when our students are not being supported as it is?

Lower the board members pay - pay the teachers more

The increases over the past several years are unsustainable. We bought in barre town because of the school and liveable tax rates. Since then, we have seen several double digit increases and our taxes are now doubled. In 8 years. I also am concerned about the technology use. Please take my child on a field trip for some real world experiences instead of looking up the life cycle of a frog on the promethium boards. My daughter is in 3rd grade and has had one friend trip to the barre opera house. I also am very concerned about the liberal agenda making its way into curriculum.

Stop looking at the classrooms and start at the top.

Concerns I have about the budget being voted down: -classroom budgets and how teachers already spend so much out of pocket - losing SRO or police presence -losing clubs and afterschool programs, and I am sure much more but these are the top three concerns that I currently have and that is without feeling like I have all the information around what this budget cut will actually entail for us on a day to day basis.

No tax hike

We need to prioritize the needs of the students, including those who partake on extracurricular activities, for instance athletics... Recently we were able to put in place a school baseball program. However, these kids do have access to any facilities or necessary resources to give them a chance to grow and develop. Not only do we lack an actual baseball field, which could be created for very little cost (potential grant money) on the North Field, while still allowing lacrosse and soccer to access the space but, we can't even provide funding for them to have a batting cage and pitching machine. These are items that individual families can afford to install on their own property, but as a community we can't find for our children... additionally, the lack of busing transportation for athletics puts parents in an unreasonable situation. Baseball games begin at 4pm, all over the area, players need to arrive no later than 30 minutes early, and sometimes games are more than an hour away. The majority of families have parents who work until 4pm. Asking them to be responsible for transporting their student athlete is unreasonable, and in many cases not possible. Surrounding communities have no problem providing athletic facilities and transportation. If this is made a priority, to be put in place by next spring, you will get my vote. If

it's not, you can count on not only failing to get my support, but also the support of at least 60-85 other voters that have pledged their allegiance to vote no, until they see that this items are prioritized for the 2024-2025 school year... My suggestion, start building a Babe Ruth size field on the North Field at Barre City. It doesn't need a permanent outfield fence, the costs should be minimal. And make sure players are bused to games


