A Note from the Principal

Heusner Parents,

We know that attendance matters! Tardies and absences equal missed learning opportunities and social emotional experiences. Missing school can make it harder to build relationships and develop healthy routines. Students can fall behind if they just miss 1 or 2 days every few weeks.

Being late to school can cause students to feel anxious, frustrated or embarrassed. A pattern of being late can lead to poor attendance or students being reluctant to go to school. We have noticed an increase in tardies at Heusner in the last month. So, we have decided to set a school-wide challenge goal focused on students being on time to school. We need your help setting your student up for success. Please have your student here by 8:20 a.m. Our goal is to have less than 10 kiddos arriving late each day.

When students arrive on time they get to participate in things like High Five Fridays - where various community groups High Five our students as they come in, Morning Meetings - where they connect and play games with their classmates, and Pride Family Time - where they meet with cross-aged groups of students.

Thanks for helping us to make school a priority. Attendance matters!






P.E.

Music



The months of November and December are very busy in the music room. **Preschool and Kindergarten** classes are singing and moving to songs about turkeys and loud and quiet.

First graders are continuing to review quarter notes, eighth notes and quarter note rests. We have been matching pitch on so/mi and using our singing voices to see if we can match pitch. We played tambourines, triangles, hand drums and sticks along with the steady beat.

Second graders were just introduced to KING WHOLE NOTE, and we learned that the whole note takes up the entire measure or 4 beats. Bar lines and time signatures will be a continuing skill used throughout this year. We are currently working on playing different rhythm patterns while singing an African American Spiritual at a fast tempo.



Third graders were excited to share their music program *The High Seas* on NOVEMBER 16. There were pirates, sea creatures, mermen/mermaids and sailors



Fourth graders were excited to share their recorder skills on NOVEMBER 16. We are focused in on G-A-B and E. December has us learning a few winter songs on our recorders that we will get to share with the entire building on the day before winter break.






Fifth grade students are finishing up our ukulele unit and are now moving onto rhythmic activities on bucket drums. We are excited to play bucket drums for the entire school on the day before winter break. We are focusing on staying together as an ensemble and listening to each other to keep a steady beat while playing a variety of rhythms

Art

In the art room, **first grade** classes are creating an animal farm by making origami animals. **Second grade** classes are using texture plates to create texture rubbings for their ice cream mosaics that are inspired by Jim Bachor. Students have found different textures in a scavenger hunt to decide what they would like on their mosaic. **Third, fourth, and fifth grade** classes are all using gelli plates to create textures and patterns for their mosaic piece that is inspired by Jim Bachor. **Third and fourth grade** are going to be making their names with fourth grade focusing on balance in their piece. **Fifth grade** will be creating the school mascot.




Social Emotional Team

As we enter December, we will be focusing on Response Inhibition. Response Inhibition is the ability to stop and wait, or stop and think, before making a decision. We talk about how to handle exciting activities happening in the classrooms, and how to be in control and have fun at the same time. Ways to strengthen your child's skill of response inhibition at home include providing opportunities to wait, promote delayed gratification, and pre-teach expectations. All board/card games provide the opportunity to strengthen this skill!







Math Corner

Math Facts Fluency: We definitely want to keep children's math facts fresh over holiday breaks. Play mental math-counting games in the car, math war at restaurants, or have a math family game night so the efficiency and accuracy don't slow down. Here's a fun game that can be played at home with just a deck of cards. It can be played with addition and subtraction or multiplication and division!

HOW TO PLAY SALUTE: A MATH FACTS CARD GAME

Set-Up and Preparation:

Get into a group of three. Each group needs a deck of cards, with the face cards and jokers taken out (just keep the numbers 2-10).



Player #1 and Player #2 sit facing one another, with the deck of cards between them. Player #3 sits off to the side so that he/she can see both players' faces.

How To Play:

- Player #1 and #2 each pick up a card, and without looking at it, place it on their foreheads. They can see what each other has, but they do not know which card they are holding.
- Player #3 (who can see both cards) mentally adds the cards together and says the sum out loud. For example, if Player #1 is holding a 6 and Player #2 is holding a 10, Player #3 says "16."
- Once Player #3 has said the sum out loud, Players #1 and #2 each try to figure out what card he/she is holding. So if the sum is 16, and Player #1 can see that Player #2 is holding a 10, he can perform a mental subtraction equation to figure out what he has (16-10=6). The first player to correctly state which card they are holding keeps both cards. The player with the most cards at the end of the game wins.

Differentiation Tip: This game can also be played with multiplication/division.
