## iAcademy - Athens Elementary

- We celebrated our amazing media specialist, Leisha Russell, and our awesome assistant principal, Nick Looney, during National Assistant principal's week and Media Specialist Recognition Day! These two educators are invaluable to us at Athens Elementary and we are so thankful for them and all they do for our students and teachers!
- Our 2nd and 3rd graders took the ACAP test in math and ELA this month. Students have worked so hard all year long and we are so proud of their effort during testing. We will reward the students with a special ice cream treat at the end of the month for their attendance and hard work on testing!
- Our teachers engaged in an embedded professional learning season on April 10 focused on powerful
  task design. Teachers participated in a learning walk and then collaboratively analyzed a task to see
  what they could do to increase the rigor of the task. They then learned about how to reflect on their
  weekly planning sessions using the Su Henry framework for instructional conversations.
- We have 3 athletes who will be competing in the Special Olympics on Tuesday! Ona Mays, Cooper Kuske, and Simon Mitchell. We are so excited to see them compete!

## **Heart Academy – Julian Newman Elementary**

- We started April off with testing all 2nd and 3rd graders on the ACAP assessment. We tested 100% of all students.
- We are beginning one on one assessments with k-3rd grade students this week using iReady. This is a benchmark assessment that is given 3 times a year. With this data we are able to determine grade level proficiency and determine reading/math deficiencies.

April 22-26 is Every Kid Healthy Week This week is an annual celebration of school health and
wellness achievements. Each day we focus on nutrition, physical activity, mental health and learning.
We have set aside Wednesday, April 24th and invited Parents to PE.

## Fame Academy - Brookhill Elementary

- Students participated in the Alabama Comprehensive Testing Program.

## SPARK Academy - Cowart Elementary School
