Indent second and subsequent lines of entries five spaces—a "hanging indent."

Henderson, Amy. *On the Air*. Washington, DC: Smithsonian Institution Press, 1988. Print.

If no author is listed, alphabetize to the first word in the title (except A, An, or The).

Monk, Linda R., ed. *Ordinary Americans*. Alexandria, VA: Close Up, 1994. Print.

"Radio as a Medium of Communication." *The Encyclopedia Americana*. International ed. Boston: McGraw-Hill, 1998. Print.

Stark, Phyllis. "On the Air." *Billboard* 1 Nov. 1994: 120-124. Print.

Welner, Neil. "Stories from Early Radio." *Background Briefing*. N.p., 14 Apr. 1996. Web. 28 Mar. 1999.

Include the type of source for each entry (e.g., Web, Print, etc.).
