#### **BACKGROUND**:

The Open Meetings Act (the "Act") was adopted in 1967 with the sole intent of making governmental decision-making accessible to the public. (It was codified without substantive change as Government Code Chapter 551.) The "Act" requires meetings of governmental bodies (school district board of trustees) to be open to the public, except for expressly authorized closed sessions, and to be preceded by public notice of the time, place and subject matter of the meeting.

Section 551.021 of the Texas Government Code states that (a) A governmental body shall prepare and keep minutes of each open meeting of the body with the minutes containing the subject of each deliberation and indicating action taken on each vote, order or decision. Section 551.022 provides that the minutes are public records and shall be available for public inspection and copying on request to the governmental body's chief administrative officer or designee.

In order to maintain compliance with Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code and the Texas Open Meetings Act, the Board must approve each set of minutes presented. Upon approval, the minutes can then be made available to the public as an official record of a given meeting.

#### **<u>TOPIC:</u>** APPROVE RATIFICATION OF RENTAL OF ATHANS AUDIO VISUAL EQUIPMENT FOR THE 2020 SENIOR CELEBRATIONS AT FARRINGTON FIELD AND CLARK STADIUM

#### **BACKGROUND:**

In anticipation of hosting in-person graduations for our 2020 seniors, Fort Worth ISD contracted Athans Audio Visual to provide video imaging services at several sites hosting the graduation ceremonies. However, because of COVID-19 restrictions prohibiting large in-person gatherings, the traditional in-person graduation ceremonies were cancelled. Striving to honor seniors in a manner that did not minimize their achievement, Fort Worth ISD decided to hold a virtual commencement ceremony to acknowledge the 2020 graduates. In addition, after discussions with a group of 2020 class leaders, the Superintendent agreed to allow outdoor in-person senior celebrations which are consistent with the most recently released guidelines set by the Texas Education Agency for such ceremonies. Currently, FWISD has only two facilities, Farrington Field and Clark Stadium, large enough to accommodate these outdoor celebrations. Because both sites have outdated AV systems, the support required from Athans AV increased significantly. Eighteen senior celebrations, with twenty-one schools participating, are scheduled for June 22-26, 2020.

## **TOPIC:** APPROVE VISUAL ART DIGITAL PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

#### **BACKGROUND:**

There is a large percentage of visual arts teachers who have earned a Studio Fine Arts degree and obtained an alternative certification to teach. The lack of pedagogical knowledge results in decreased classroom engagement, inequity in the quality of instruction across the district, and a decrease in student achievement. This in turn increases turnover and creates a need for the continual training of new art educators. The Art of Ed Pro is an on-demand personalized professional development platform designed for k-12 art teachers with hands-on tutorials, and resources. In February, fifteen art teachers, the Director of Visual Arts, and the Art Specialist participated in a trial to evaluate the quality of the service. All agreed the tool would be beneficial for new and seasoned art education staff. The Department will use 2019-2020 funding for the purchase; thus, giving teachers access to the program in June 2020.

This on-demand professional development platform can be personalized to meet the needs of our K-12 Art Teachers.







### **TOPIC:** APPROVE 2020 ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAM FEES

## **BACKGROUND:**

The Advanced Placement (AP) program is a College Board program offered at all traditional high school sites, Academies and Collegiate Programs with AP eligible grade levels, and two middle school sites offering AP World Language programs. Fort Worth ISD offers all 36 of College Board's AP course offerings. All AP teachers are required to submit a professional syllabus to College Board's AP Audit online system to ensure course instruction that adheres to College Board guidelines. College and Career Readiness Coordinators are the College Board AP Coordinator of record and facilitate student registration and exam administration on campus.

Qualifying scores of 3, 4 or 5 create eligibility for college credit or advanced college coursework placement. We, the members of the Fort Worth Independent School District Racial Equity Committee, are horrified, outraged, and saddened by the recent murders of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor,

Ahmaud Arbery, and other Black citizens in our country in recent weeks, including Fort Worth's own, Atatiana Jefferson.

While certain groups see law enforcement as members of society that pledge to protect and serve, communities of color have had numerous traumatic experiences that have been historically ignored. Police practices are deeply rooted in White supremacy stemming from night patrols, slave patrols, and the Texas Rangers (Martinez, 2018; Oluo, 2019). These traumatic experiences impact every area of our Black community, including the school systems.

Three years ago, the Racial Equity Committee made a recommendation to the Board that the Fort Worth Independent School District take a bold stand against systemic racism and work towards equity transformation at all levels. In response, the Board unanimously approved the FWISD Racial and Ethnic Equity Policy. The policy outlines institutional racism throughout our system and declares that "the responsibility for addressing these disparities among students rests with the adults, not with the students." In this moment, we renew our commitment to the responsibility we have to the students and communities of color in the Fort Worth Independent School District.

As members of the Racial Equity Committee we will speak out against the perpetual White supremacy, systemic racism, and the anti-Blackness we observe and experience. The need for action to accompany our words is imperative. We will support our school district in conducting a full Racial Equity Audit at every school and district wide. This tool will be used by the Racial Equity Committee and FWISD Leadership to identify and eliminate systems, policies and practices which perpetuate racism in our schools and community.

We reaffirm our commitment to removing policies and practices that uphold White supremacy, ensuring that students and families in FWISD know that we do- and will continue to work for social justice and racial equity. At a time when trust in public institutions is rightfully questioned, we have a responsibility to ensure communities of color are heard and have trust in our school district. We will partner with the district to host community conversations and town hall meetings to discuss and develop solutions for racial inequities. As members of the Racial Equity Committee, we have the privilege of exercising our voice with district leaders and decision makers on a regular basis. We also recognize that we have a duty to elevate the voices of all communities of color in the district.

We understand that racial injustice is systemic and deeply rooted in the history of our country, but it must stop now.

- I will reach out to those who are different from me in order to break down the walls that divide us.
- I commit to honor and embrace diversity and treat individuals as I would hope to be treated.
